- 1 Honoring the life and memory of LeeAnn Noble; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
3 with the passing of LeeAnn Noble; and
- 4 WHEREAS, LeeAnn was a member of the University of North Georgia women's golf team
5 and a nursing student; and
- 6 WHEREAS, in addition to being a leader on her team, LeeAnn was a member of the
7 student-athlete advisory committee and was an active and involved member of the university
8 community; and
- 9 WHEREAS, before enrolling at the University of North Georgia, she was a standout golfer
10 at Gainesville High School, where she graduated third in her class and was named the Hall
11 County Player of the Year in 2011; and
- 12 WHEREAS, while excelling in golf, LeeAnn was also active as varsity cheerleader captain,
13 student council officer, and member of the yearbook, homecoming court, and prom court;

- 15 WHEREAS, this past October, LeeAnn was featured as the cover story of the NCAA's
16 *Champion* Magazine; the four-page spread and accompanying cover detailed her early
17 childhood battle with a heart transplant and how, as a Make-A-Wish recipient, she used her
18 amazing story of courage to spearhead the school's Make-A-Wish initiative; and
- 19 WHEREAS, a young woman of faith, LeeAnn was an active member of The First United
20 Methodist Church in Gainesville; and

21 WHEREAS, she leaves behind her mother and stepfather, Carol Ann and Joe Gelderman;
22 father, Timothy Noble; and grandparents, Jolaine Noble, Helen Harrington, Bill Gelderman,
23 and Janie Carnley; and

24 WHEREAS, LeeAnn gave inspiration to many through her high ideals, morals, and deep
25 concern for her fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding she
26 demonstrated to her family and friends were admired by others; and

27 WHEREAS, she was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation
28 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example she made of her life,
29 she made this world a better place in which to live; and

30 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous woman, LeeAnn will long be remembered for
31 her love of family and friendship, and this loyal young woman and friend will be missed by
32 all who had the great fortune of knowing her.

33 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
34 the members of this body join in honoring the life and memory of LeeAnn Noble and express
