## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Article 3 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2	relating to invasions of privacy, so as to provide for a definition; to provide for the lawful use
3	of unmanned aircraft; to prohibit the capturing of certain images by unmanned aircraft; to
4	prohibit the possession, disclosure, display, distribution, or other use of such improperly
5	captured images; to provide for penalties; to provide for defenses to prosecution; to restrict
6	the use of such images; to provide for civil actions for violations; to provide for rule-making
7	authority for the Department of Public Safety for law enforcement use of such unmanned
8	aircraft; to provide for certain reports; to provide for related matters; to provide for an
9	effective date and applicability; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.
10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
11	SECTION 1.
12	Article 3 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
13	invasions of privacy, is amended by adding a new part to read as follows:
14	" <u>Part 4</u>
15	<u>16-11-95.</u>
16	As used in this part, the term 'image' means any capturing of sound waves; thermal,
17	infrared, ultraviolet, visible light, or other electromagnetic waves; odor; or other conditions
18	existing on or about real property in this state or an individual located on such property.
19	<u>16-11-95.1.</u>
20	(a) It shall be lawful to capture an image using an unmanned aircraft in this state:
21	(1) For purposes of professional or scholarly research and development by a person
22	acting on behalf of an institution of higher education in this state, including a person who:
23	(A) Is a professor, employee, or student of the institution; or

24	(B) Is under contract with or otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of the
25	institution;
26	(2) In airspace designated as a test site or range authorized by the Federal Aviation
27	Administration for the purpose of integrating unmanned aircraft systems into the national
28	airspace;
29	(3) As part of an operation, exercise, or mission of any branch of the United States
30	military;
31	(4) If the image is captured by a satellite for the purpose of mapping;
32	(5) If the image is captured by or for an electric or natural gas utility:
33	(A) For operations and maintenance of utility facilities for the purpose of maintaining
34	utility system reliability and integrity;
35	(B) For inspecting utility facilities to determine repair, maintenance, or replacement
36	needs during and after construction of such facilities;
37	(C) For assessing vegetation growth for the purpose of maintaining clearances on
38	utility easements; and
39	(D) For utility facility routing and siting for the purpose of providing utility service;
40	(6) With the consent of the individual who owns or lawfully occupies the real property
41	captured in the image;
42	(7) Pursuant to a valid search or arrest warrant;
43	(8) If the image is captured by a law enforcement authority or a person who is under
44	contract with or otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of a law enforcement
45	authority:
46	(A) In immediate pursuit of a person law enforcement officers have reasonable
47	suspicion to believe or probable cause to suspect has committed an offense, not
48	including misdemeanors or offenses punishable by a fine only;
49	(B) For the purpose of documenting a crime scene where an offense, not including
50	misdemeanors or offenses punishable by a fine only, has been committed;
51	(C) For the purpose of investigating the scene of:
52	(i) A human fatality;
53	(ii) A motor vehicle accident causing death or serious bodily injury to a person; or
54	(iii) Any motor vehicle accident on a state highway or federal interstate or highway;
55	(D) In connection with the search for a missing person;
56	(E) For the purpose of conducting a high-risk tactical operation that poses a threat to
57	human life; or
58	(F) Of private property that is generally open to the public where the property owner
59	consents to law enforcement public safety responsibilities;

60 (9) If the image is captured by state or local law enforcement authorities, or a person who is under contract with or otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of such 61 62 authorities, for the purpose of: 63 (A) Surveying the scene of a catastrophe or other damage to determine whether a state 64 of emergency should be declared; (B) Preserving public safety, protecting property, or surveying damage or 65 66 contamination during a lawfully declared state of emergency; or (C) Conducting routine air quality sampling and monitoring, as provided by state or 67 68 local law; 69 (10) At the scene of a spill, or a suspected spill, of hazardous materials; (11) For the purpose of fire suppression; 70 71 (12) For the purpose of rescuing a person whose life or well-being is in imminent danger; 72 (13) If the image is captured by a real estate broker who is licensed in this state in 73 connection with the marketing, sale, or financing of real property, provided that no 74 individual is identifiable in the image; (14) From a height no more than eight feet above ground level in a public place, if the 75 76 image was captured without using any electronic, mechanical, or other means to amplify 77 the image beyond normal human perception; 78 (15) Of public real property or a person on such property; 79 (16) If the image is captured by the owner or operator of an oil, gas, water, or other 80 pipeline for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining, or repairing pipelines or other related 81 facilities and is captured without the intent to conduct surveillance on an individual or 82 real property located in this state; 83 (17) In connection with oil pipeline safety and protection; (18) In connection with port authority surveillance and security; or 84 85 (19) In connection with the filming of a motion picture or television program. 86 (b) This part does not apply to the manufacture, assembly, distribution, or sale of an 87 unmanned aircraft. 88 <u>16-11-95.2.</u> 89 (a) It shall be illegal for a person to use an unmanned aircraft to capture an image of an 90 individual or privately owned real property in this state with the intent to conduct 91 surveillance on such individual or property. (b) Any person who violates this Code section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. 92 (c) It is a defense to prosecution under this Code section that the person destroyed the 93 94 <u>image:</u>

95 (1) As soon as the person had knowledge that the image was captured in violation of this 96 Code section; and 97 (2) Without disclosing, displaying, or distributing the image to a third party. 98 <u>16-11-95.3.</u> 99 (a) It shall be illegal for a person to: (1) Capture an image in violation of Code Section 16-11-95.2; and 100 101 (2) Possess, disclose, display, distribute, or otherwise use such image. 102 (b) Any person who violates subsection (a) of this Code section by possessing an image 103 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Any person who violates subsection (a) of this Code 104 section by disclosing, displaying, distributing, or otherwise using an image shall be guilty 105 of a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature. (c) Each image a person possesses, discloses, displays, distributes, or otherwise uses in 106 107 violation of this Code section shall constitute a separate offense. 108 (d) It shall be a defense to prosecution under this Code section for the possession of an 109 image that the person destroyed the image as soon as the person had knowledge that the 110 image was captured in violation of Code Section 16-11-95.2. 111 (e) It shall be a defense to prosecution under this Code section for the disclosure, display, 112 distribution, or other use of an image that the person stopped disclosing, displaying, 113 distributing, or otherwise using the image as soon as the person had knowledge that the 114 image was captured in violation of Code Section 16-11-95.2. 115 16-11-95.4. (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this Code section, an image captured 116 117 in violation of Code Section 16-11-95.2 or an image captured by an unmanned aircraft that 118 was incidental to the lawful capturing of an image: 119 (1) Shall not be used as evidence in any criminal or juvenile proceeding, civil action, or 120 administrative proceeding; 121 (2) Shall not be subject to disclosure, inspection, or copying under Article 4 of 122 Chapter 18 of Title 50; and 123 (3) Shall not be subject to discovery, subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion for 124 its release. 125 (b) An image described in subsection (a) of this Code section may be disclosed and used as evidence to prove a violation of this part and is subject to discovery, subpoena, or other 126 127 means of legal compulsion for such purpose.

128	<u>16-11-95.5.</u>
129	(a) As used in this Code section, the term 'malice' means a specific intent by the defendant
130	to cause substantial injury or harm to the claimant.
131	(b) An owner or tenant of privately owned real property located in this state may bring
132	against a person who, in violation of Code Section 16-11-95.2, captured an image of the
133	property or the owner or tenant while on the property an action to:
134	(1) Enjoin a violation or imminent violation of Code Section 16-11-95.2 or 16-11-95.3;
135	(2) Recover a civil penalty of:
136	(A) Five thousand dollars for all images captured in a single episode in violation of
137	<u>Code Section 16-11-95.2; or</u>
138	(B) Ten thousand dollars for disclosure, display, distribution, or other use of any
139	images captured in a single episode in violation of Code Section 16-11-95.3; or
140	(3) Recover actual damages if the person who captured the image in violation of Code
141	Section 16-11-95.3 discloses, displays, or distributes the image with malice.
142	(c) For purposes of recovering the civil penalty or actual damages under subsection (b) of
143	this Code section, all owners of a parcel of real property are considered to be a single
144	owner and all tenants of a parcel of real property are considered to be a single tenant.
145	(d) In addition to any civil penalties authorized under this Code section, the court shall
146	award court costs and reasonable attorney's fees to the prevailing party.
147	(e) An action brought under this Code section shall be commenced within two years from
148	the date the image was:
149	(1) Captured in violation of Code Section 16-11-95.2; or
150	(2) Initially disclosed, displayed, distributed, or otherwise used in violation of Code
151	<u>Section 16-11-95.3.</u>
152	<u>16-11-95.6.</u>
153	(a) It shall be illegal to operate an unmanned aircraft at an altitude in excess of 1,000 feet
154	above ground level.
155	(b) It shall be illegal to operate an unmanned aircraft in a horizontal radius of five statute
156	miles from the geographic center of any airport in this state unless such operation is
157	approved by the airport control tower or, in the case of an uncontrolled airport, the agency
158	or authority in charge of the operation of such airport.
159	<u>16-11-95.7.</u>
160	The Department of Public Safety shall adopt rules and guidelines for the use of an

161 <u>unmanned aircraft by law enforcement authorities in this state.</u>

162	<u>16-11-95.8.</u>
163	(a) Not earlier than January 1 and not later than January 15 of each odd-numbered year,
164	each state law enforcement agency and each county or municipal law enforcement agency
165	located in a county or municipality that used or operated an unmanned aircraft during the
166	preceding 24 months shall issue a written report to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor,
167	and each member of the General Assembly and shall:
168	(1) Retain the report for public viewing; and
169	(2) Post the report on the law enforcement agency's publicly accessible website, if one
170	exists.
171	(b) The report shall include:
172	(1) The number of times an unmanned aircraft was used, organized by date, time,
173	location, and the types of incidents and justification for the use;
174	(2) The number of criminal investigations aided by the use of an unmanned aircraft and
175	a description of how the unmanned aircraft aided each investigation;
176	(3) The number of times an unmanned aircraft aided a law enforcement operation other
177	than a criminal investigation, the dates and locations of such operations, and a description
178	of how the unmanned aircraft aided each operation;
179	(4) The type of information collected on an individual, residence, property, or area that
180	was not the subject of a law enforcement operation and the frequency of the collection
181	of such information; and
182	(5) The total cost of acquiring, maintaining, repairing, and operating or otherwise using
183	each unmanned aircraft for the preceding 24 months."
184	<b>SECTION 2.</b>
185	This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2015, and shall apply to the use of unmanned
186	aircraft on and after such date.
