

Senate Resolution 97

A RESOLUTION

1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to provide that taxes on motor fuels shall
 2 be appropriated for any or all public transportation purposes; to provide for submission of
 3 this amendment for ratification or rejection; and for other purposes.

4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

5 SECTION 1.

6 Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI of the Constitution is amended by revising
 7 subparagraph (b) as follows:

8 "(b)(1) An amount equal to all money derived from motor fuel taxes received by the state
 9 in each of the immediately preceding fiscal years, less the amount of refunds, rebates, and
 10 collection costs authorized by law, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year beginning
 11 July 1, of each year following, for all activities incident to providing and maintaining an
 12 adequate system of public roads and bridges transportation in this state, as authorized by
 13 laws enacted by the General Assembly of Georgia, and for grants to counties by law
 14 authorizing road construction and maintenance, as provided by law authorizing such
 15 grants. Said sum is hereby appropriated for, and shall be available for, the aforesaid
 16 purposes regardless of whether the General Assembly enacts a general appropriations
 17 Act; and said sum need not be specifically stated in any general appropriations Act passed
 18 by the General Assembly in order to be available for such purposes. However, this shall
 19 not preclude the General Assembly from appropriating for such purposes an amount
 20 greater than the sum specified above for such purposes. The expenditure of such funds
 21 shall be subject to all the rules, regulations, and restrictions imposed on the expenditure
 22 of appropriations by provisions of the Constitution and laws of this state, unless such
 23 provisions are in conflict with the provisions of this paragraph. And provided, however,
 24 that the proceeds of the tax hereby appropriated shall not be subject to budgetary
 25 reduction. In the event of invasion of this state by land, sea, or air or in case of a major
 26 catastrophe so proclaimed by the Governor, said funds may be utilized for defense or
 27 relief purposes on the executive order of the Governor.
