7 College; and

9 Baptist Association and retired from Clayton County Board of Education; and
- 10 WHEREAS, a woman of deep and abiding faith, Mildred was an active member and Sunday  
11 School teacher at Shiloh Baptist Church and Clear Springs Missionary Baptist Church, where  
12 she served as First Lady; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Mildred was united in love and marriage to Benjamin H. Glass, Sr., and was  
14 blessed with four remarkable children, Dr. Dawn Watkins (Anthony), Benjamin Harold  
15 Glass, Jr., Quentin Eugene Glass, and Shannon Ford (James); ten wonderful grandchildren,

17 Anaya Watkins, Elijah Glass, and Tyler Stokley-Glass; and two great-grandchildren, Mikal

20 for her fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding she demonstrated to
