## A RESOLUTION

Recognizing February 12, 2015, as Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking Awareness Day at the 1

2 state capitol; and for other purposes.

- 3 WHEREAS, domestic minor sex trafficking (DMST) is a horrific crime perpetrated by adult
- 4 men and women who abuse children through commercial exploitation; and

5 WHEREAS, according to Georgia Cares, the state-wide system of care, 1,117 referrals for 6 exploited and trafficked children have been received since 2009; and

7 WHEREAS, according to youthSpark, a scientific study of men who buy sex with young 8 females found that 7,200 men pay for sex with adolescent females each month in Georgia, accounting for 8,700 paid sex acts, and a significant portion of these men are repeat 9 10 customers; and

11 WHEREAS, hundreds of grassroots activists will gather at the state capitol on February 12, 12 2015, to raise awareness about the need to end domestic minor sex trafficking in Georgia; 13 and

WHEREAS, Georgia Cares, Street Grace, youthSpark, and Wellspring Living have worked 14 15 together to organize and empower tens of thousands of grassroots activists across the State 16 of Georgia to end DMST.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that 17 the members of this body recognize February 12, 2015, as Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking 18 19 Day at the state capitol.
