A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 nurses, so as to revise various provisions relating to the licensure of registered professional 3 nurses and licensed practical nurses; to revise provisions relating to the powers and duties 4 of the Georgia Board of Nursing; to provide for acceptance of nursing education programs 5 located outside the United States; to provide for a time period for applicants who do not pass the licensing examination; to revise provisions relating to renewal of licensure; to provide 6 7 for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 8 purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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SECTION 1.

11 Chapter 26 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to nurses, is 12 amended in Code Section 43-26-5, relating to general powers and responsibilities of the

13 Georgia Board of Nursing, by revising subsection (a) as follows:

14 "(a) The board shall:

(1) Be responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this chapter and shall be
 specifically granted all of the necessary duties, powers, and authority to carry out this
 responsibility;

18 (2) Be authorized to draft, adopt, amend, repeal, and enforce such rules as it deems
 19 necessary for the administration and enforcement of this chapter in the protection of
 20 public health, safety, and welfare;

- 21 (3) Enforce qualifications for licensure under this article or Article 2 of this chapter;
- (4) Develop and enforce reasonable and uniform standards for nursing education and
 nursing practice;
- 24 (5) Periodically evaluate nursing education programs and approve such programs as meet
- the board's requirements;
- 26 (6) Deny or withdraw approval from noncompliant nursing education programs;

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27 (7) License duly qualified applicants under this article or Article 2 of this chapter by 28 examination, endorsement, or reinstatement; 29 (8) Be authorized to issue temporary permits; 30 (9) Renew licenses of registered professional nurses, licensed undergraduate nurses, and 31 licensed practical nurses in accordance with this article or Article 2 of this chapter; 32 (10) Be authorized to set standards for competency of licensees under this article or 33 Article 2 of this chapter continuing in or returning to practice; 34 (11) Set standards for and regulate advanced nursing practice; (12) Be authorized to enact rules and regulations for registered professional nurses in 35 36 their performing acts under a nurse protocol as authorized in Code Section 43-34-23 and 37 enact rules and regulations for advanced practice registered nurses in performing acts as 38 authorized in Code Section 43-34-25; 39 (13) Implement the disciplinary process; (14) Be authorized to issue orders when a license under this article or Article 2 of this 40 41 chapter is surrendered to the board while a complaint, investigation, or disciplinary action 42 against such license is pending; (15) Issue a limited license to practice nursing or licensed practical nursing subject to 43 44 such terms and conditions as the board may impose; 45 (16) Provide consultation and conduct conferences, forums, studies, and research on 46 nursing education and nursing practice; 47 (17) Approve the selection of a qualified person to serve as executive director; 48 (18) Be authorized to appoint standing or ad hoc committees as necessary to inform and 49 make recommendations to the board about issues and concerns and to facilitate 50 communication amongst the board, licensees under this article or Article 2 of this chapter, 51 and the community; 52 (19) Maintain membership in the national organization which develops and regulates the nursing licensing examination and the practical nursing licensing examination; 53 (20) Be authorized to collect data regarding existing nursing and licensed practical 54 nursing resources in Georgia and coordinate planning for nursing education and nursing 55 56 practice; 57 (21) Determine fees; and 58 (22) Adopt a seal which shall be in the care of the executive director and shall be affixed 59 only in such a manner as prescribed by the board; and (23) Be authorized to enforce all investigative and disciplinary orders issued by the 60 former Georgia Board of Examiners of Licensed Practical Nurses." 61

15 LC 33 5961 62 **SECTION 2**. 63 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-7, relating to requirements 64 for licensure as registered professional nurse and requirements for nontraditional nursing 65 education programs, as follows: "43-26-7. 66 67 (a) Any applicant who meets the requirements of this Code section shall be eligible for 68 licensure as a registered professional nurse. (b) An applicant for licensure by examination shall: 69 70 (1) Submit a completed written application and fee; 71 (2)(A) Have graduated from an approved nursing education program, as defined in 72 Code Section 43-26-3; or 73 (B)(i) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A) of this paragraph, have graduated from a 74 nontraditional nursing education program approved by the board which meets the 75 requirements in subsection (e) of this Code section; and 76 (ii)(I) If the applicant entered the nontraditional nursing education program as a licensed practical nurse and had an academic education as a licensed practical nurse 77 78 that included clinical training in pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, 79 medical-surgical, and mental illness, have at least two years of clinical experience 80 in the five years preceding the date of the application in an acute care inpatient 81 facility or a long-term acute care facility as a licensed practical nurse, as approved 82 by the board. Such clinical experience shall be documented in writing by the 83 applicant's immediate supervisor stating that, in his or her opinion, the applicant has 84 exhibited the critical thinking abilities, clinical skills, and leadership abilities that would indicate the ability to work as a beginning registered professional nurse; 85 86 (II) If the applicant entered the nontraditional nursing education program as a 87 licensed practical nurse, had an academic education as a licensed practical nurse that included clinical training in pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, medical-surgical, 88 and mental illness, and has at least two years of experience as a licensed practical 89 90 nurse in any setting, although such experience shall be exclusive of night duty in a skilled nursing facility, but less than two years of experience in the five years 91 preceding the date of the application in an acute care inpatient facility or a 92 93 long-term acute care facility, as approved by the board, have completed a 320 hour 94 postgraduate preceptorship. If the applicant can show that he or she cannot find a preceptorship in an acute care inpatient facility or a long-term acute care facility, the 95 board may authorize a preceptorship pursuant to this subdivision in a skilled nursing 96 97 facility, if such facility has 100 beds or more and such facility ensures to the board

that the applicant will be providing health care to patients with similar health care
needs as those patients in a long-term acute care facility;

100 (III) If the applicant entered the nontraditional nursing education program as (1) a paramedic with at least two years of experience as a paramedic or (2) a licensed 101 practical nurse with less than two years of clinical experience in the five years 102 103 preceding the date of the application in an acute care inpatient facility or a long-term acute care facility as a licensed practical nurse whose academic training 104 105 as a licensed practical nurse did not include clinical training in pediatrics, obstetrics 106 and gynecology, medical-surgical, and mental illness, have completed a 480 hour postgraduate preceptorship. Such preceptorship shall be in the area or areas as 107 determined by the board on a case-by-case basis, which may include pediatrics, 108 109 obstetrics and gynecology, medical-surgical, mental illness, and transition into the role of a registered professional nurse; 110

(IV) If the applicant entered the nontraditional nursing education program as a
military medical corpsman and has at least two years of experience as a military
medical corpsman, have completed a postgraduate preceptorship of at least 480
hours but not more than 640 hours, as determined by the board; or

115 (V) If the applicant does not meet the requirements of subdivision (I), (II), (III), or 116 (IV) of this division and the applicant entered a nontraditional nursing education 117 program before July 1, 2008, which meets the requirements of subsection (e) of this 118 Code section and completes such program no later than June 30, 2015, have 119 completed a 640 hour postgraduate preceptorship arranged by the applicant under the supervision of a registered professional nurse. The preceptorship shall have 120 prior approval of the board, and successful completion of the preceptorship shall be 121 122 verified in writing by the preceptor. The preceptorship shall be in an acute care 123 inpatient facility or a long-term acute care facility; provided, however, that the 124 board may authorize a preceptorship pursuant to this subdivision in other facilities to obtain specialized experience in certain areas. 125

All preceptorships required pursuant to this division shall be arranged by the applicant 126 under the close supervision of a registered professional nurse where such applicant 127 is transitioned into the role of a registered professional nurse and the applicant 128 performs duties typically performed by registered professional nurses. Except as 129 130 otherwise provided in subdivision (II) of this division, a preceptorship shall be in an acute care inpatient facility or a long-term acute care facility; provided, however, that 131 the board may authorize a preceptorship in other facilities to obtain specialized 132 133 experience in certain areas. The preceptorship shall have prior approval of the board, and successful completion of the preceptorship shall be documented in writing by the 134

135 preceptor stating that, in his or her opinion, the applicant has exhibited the critical thinking abilities, clinical skills, and leadership abilities necessary to practice as a 136 137 beginning registered professional nurse. No later than August 1, 2011, the board shall 138 develop and make available one or more standard forms for use by and assistance to applicants in securing and completing preceptorships. Such form or forms shall 139 140 include information relating to the specific requirements for preceptorships, including 141 the minimum qualifications of the preceptor, the type of training required, and the documentation required upon completion of the preceptorship. The board shall make 142 143 the determinations required by this division in accordance with its established 144 guidelines; or

(C) Have graduated from a nursing education program located outside of the United
 States that is determined by the board to be equivalent to and not less stringent than an
 approved nursing education program as defined in Code Section 43-26-3;

(3) Pass a board recognized licensing examination; provided, however, that such 148 149 examination may not be taken prior to graduation from the approved nursing education In no way shall the passage of such examination by a graduate of a 150 program. nontraditional nursing education program who does not meet the other requirements of 151 152 this subsection be construed to authorize such individual to practice nursing, to require 153 the board to license such individual as a registered professional nurse other than to issue in its sole discretion a temporary permit pursuant to Code Section 43-26-8, or to be 154 155 endorsed from another state as a registered professional nurse;

156 (4) Have satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the 157 Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as determined by the board. Application for a license under this Code section shall 158 159 constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform 160 a criminal background check. Each applicant who submits an application to the board for licensure by examination agrees to provide the board with any and all information 161 necessary to run a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable 162 sets of fingerprints. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the 163 performance of such background check; and 164

165 (5) Complete further education and training if the applicant has not passed the

- 166 examination within a time period established by the board, which shall not exceed three
- 167 years. Such education and training may include the successful completion of an approved
- 168 nursing education program as defined in Code Section 43-26-3; and
- 169 (5)(6) Meet such other criteria as established by the board.
- 170 (c) An applicant for licensure by endorsement shall:
- 171 (1) Submit a completed written application and fee;

(2)(A) Have passed a board recognized licensing examination following graduation
from an approved nursing education program, as defined in Code Section 43-26-3; or
(B) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A) of this paragraph, have graduated from a
nontraditional nursing education program approved by the board which meets the
requirements in subsection (e) of this Code section;

(3) Submit verification of initial and current licensure in any other licensing jurisdictionadministering a board recognized licensing examination;

(4)(A) Have practiced nursing as a registered professional nurse for a period of time
as determined by the board or have graduated from a nursing education program within
the four years immediately preceding the date of the application Meet continuing
competency requirements as established by the board;

183 (B) If the applicant entered a nontraditional nursing education program as a licensed practical nurse whose academic education as a licensed practical nurse included clinical 184 training in pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, medical-surgical, and mental illness, 185 have practiced nursing as a registered professional nurse in a health care facility for at 186 least one year in the three years preceding the date of the application, and such practice 187 is documented by the applicant and approved by the board; provided, however, that for 188 189 an applicant that who does not meet the experience requirement of this subparagraph, 190 the board shall require the applicant to complete a 320 hour postgraduate preceptorship 191 arranged by the applicant under the oversight of a registered nurse where such applicant 192 is transitioned into the role of a registered professional nurse. The preceptorship shall 193 have prior approval of the board, and successful completion of the preceptorship shall 194 be verified in writing by the preceptor; or

(C) If the applicant entered a nontraditional nursing education program as anything 195 196 other than a licensed practical nurse whose academic education as a licensed practical nurse included clinical training in pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, 197 medical-surgical, and mental illness, have graduated from such program and practiced 198 nursing as a registered professional nurse in a health care facility for at least two years 199 in the five years preceding the date of the application, and such practice is documented 200 201 by the applicant and approved by the board; provided, however, that for an applicant that who does not meet the experience requirement of this subparagraph, the board shall 202 require the applicant to complete a postgraduate preceptorship of at least 480 hours but 203 204 not more than 640 hours, as determined by the board, arranged by the applicant under the oversight of a registered professional nurse where such applicant is transitioned into 205 the role of a registered professional nurse. The preceptorship shall have prior approval 206 207 of the board, and successful completion of the preceptorship shall be verified in writing 208 by the preceptor.

For purposes of this paragraph, the term 'health care facility' means an acute care 209 inpatient facility, a long-term acute care facility, an ambulatory surgical center or 210 211 obstetrical facility as defined in Code Section 31-6-2, and a skilled nursing facility, so long as such skilled nursing facility has 100 beds or more and provides health care to 212 patients with similar health care needs as those patients in a long-term acute care facility; 213 214 (5) Have satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the 215 Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as determined by the board. Application for a license under this Code section shall 216 217 constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform 218 a criminal background check. Each applicant who submits an application to the board 219 for licensure by examination agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary to run a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable 220 sets of fingerprints. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the 221 performance of such background check; and 222

(6) Meet such other criteria as established by the board.

(d) An applicant for reinstatement who has previously held a valid license in Georgia shall:

(1) Submit a completed written application and fee;

226 (2) Have practiced nursing as a registered professional nurse for a period of time as 227 determined by the board or have graduated from an approved nursing education program, as defined in Code Section 43-26-3, within the four years immediately preceding the date 228 229 of the application Meet continuing competency requirements as established by the board; 230 (3) Have satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the 231 Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as determined by the board. Application for a license under this Code section shall 232 233 constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform 234 a criminal background check. Each applicant who submits an application to the board for licensure by examination agrees to provide the board with any and all information 235 necessary to run a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable 236 237 sets of fingerprints. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the performance of such background check; and 238

- (4) Meet such other criteria as established by the board.
- 240 (e) A nontraditional nursing education program shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Is part of an institution of higher education that is approved by the appropriate
regulatory authorities of its home state;

(2) Holds regional and specialty accreditation by an accrediting body or bodies
recognized by the United States Secretary of Education or the Council for Higher
Education Accreditation;

(3) Requires its students to pass faculty determined program outcomes, including
competency based assessments of nursing knowledge and a summative performance
assessment of clinical competency of a minimum of 2 1/2 days developed by faculty
subject matter experts that follows nationally recognized standards for educational
testing; and

(4) Its graduates pass a board recognized licensing examination at a rate equivalent to

- the minimum rate required for board approved traditional nursing education programs."
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SECTION 3.

Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-33, relating to use of titlesand abbreviations by licensed practical nurses and applicants, as follows:

256 "43-26-33.

(a) Any person who is licensed as a practical nurse shall have the right to use the title
'Licensed Practical Nurse' and the abbreviation 'L.P.N.' and shall identify that he or she is
so licensed by displaying either such title or abbreviation on a name tag or similar form of
identification during times when such person is providing direct patient care. No other
person shall assume such title or use such abbreviation or any other words, letters, signs,
or symbols to indicate that such person is a licensed practical nurse in Georgia.

- (b) Any applicant for examination who holds an active temporary permit may use the title
 'Graduate Practical Nurse' and the abbreviation 'G.P.N.' until the license to practice
 practical nursing has been issued except that an applicant who fails the first examination
 may no longer use the title 'Graduate Practical Nurse' or the abbreviation 'G.P.N.' An
 individual who is qualified to use the title 'Graduate Practical Nurse' may engage in limited
 practice as defined by board rules and must practice under the on-site supervision of a
 registered professional nurse or licensed physician.
- 270 (c)(b) No person shall use the title 'nurse' or any other title or abbreviation that would
- 271 represent to the public that a person is authorized to practice nursing unless the person is
- 272 licensed or otherwise authorized under this article or Article 1 of this chapter."
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SECTION 4.

- 274 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-36, relating to application
- 275 for licensure, examination, and temporary permits, as follows:
- 276 *"*43-26-36.
- 277 (a)(1) All applicants for a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse shall make
- 278 application through the board. An applicant for licensure who has not been duly examined
- according to the prescribed examination approved by the board and who does not otherwise

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- 280 qualify for licensure under this article must apply by examination. Such applicants shall
- submit to the board a designated fee and written evidence verifying that the applicant:
- 282 (A)(1) Is at least 18 years of age;
- 283 (B)(2) Has graduated from high school or the equivalent thereof;
- 284 (C)(3) Has graduated from an approved nursing education program, as defined in Code
- 285 Section 43-26-32 or from a nursing education program located outside of the United
- 286 <u>States that is determined by the board to be equivalent to and not less stringent than an</u>
- 287 <u>approved nursing education program as defined in Code Section 43-26-32;</u>
- 288 (D)(4) Is in good physical and mental health; and
- 289 (E)(5) In the case of an applicant who has graduated from a program conducted in a
- foreign country, has demonstrated the ability to speak, write, and understand the Englishlanguage: and
- 292 (6) Meets such other criteria as established by the board.

(2)(b) A person who is at least 17 years of age and meets all of the criteria set forth in
 paragraph (1) of this subsection (a) of this Code section may apply to the board for special
 consideration to take the examination for licensure.

- 296 (b)(1) The board may issue a temporary permit to applicants for licensure by
- 297 examination pursuant to paragraph (8) of subsection (a) of Code Section 43-26-5. A
 298 temporary permit issued to an applicant for licensure by examination shall be valid from
- temporary permit issued to an applicant for licensure by examination shall be valid from
 the date of issuance until the first examination scheduled for the applicant is graded and
- 300 a license is issued. If the applicant does not appear for the examination, the temporary
- 301 permit shall automatically become invalid the day of the examination. If the applicant
- 302 fails the examination, the permit shall automatically become invalid when the
- 303 examination is graded and may not be reissued.
- 304 (2) An applicant who fails to appear at the first examination and can show proper cause
- 305 for failure to appear may receive a second temporary permit upon reapplying to take the
- 306 examination. Such second permit shall be governed by the same validity provisions as
- 307 the first permit. Upon failure to appear at a second examination, the applicant shall not
- 308 be eligible to receive another temporary permit."

SECTION 5.

Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-37, relating to issuance of
license upon passing examination and requirements for admission to subsequent
examination, as follows:

- 313 "43-26-37. (a) Any applicant who meets the license requirements stated in Code Section 43-26-36 or 314 315 subsection (b) of Code Section 43-26-38 and passes the required exam may be issued a 316 license to practice as a licensed practical nurse. (b) Effective July 1, 1995, an applicant who has not passed the examination within five 317 318 years from the date of eligibility of such applicant to take the licensure examination as 319 determined by the board shall be required to complete successfully a regular full-time 320 board approved practical nursing program before such applicant is admitted to another 321 examination. Upon completion of the program, an application may be made for licensure 322 as a new applicant. An applicant who has not passed the examination within a time period established by the board, which shall not exceed three years, shall be required to complete 323 324 further education and training which may include the successful completion of an approved
- 325 nursing education program as defined in Code Section 43-26-32."
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SECTION 6.

327 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-38, relating to license by328 endorsement and temporary permits, as follows:

329 "43-26-38.

330 (a) The board, at its discretion, may issue a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse, 331 without examination, to any person who has a high school diploma or general educational 332 development (GED) diploma and has been duly licensed or registered as a practical or 333 vocational nurse or who is entitled to perform similar service under a different designation 334 under the laws of another state or territory of the United States if the license or registration in that other state or territory is current and in good standing and was issued based upon 335 336 completion of an approved nursing education program, as defined in Code Section 337 43-26-32, and passage of an examination, which examination has been determined by the board to be substantially equal to or greater than the requirements for licensure as a 338 339 licensed practical nurse in this state, and if such person has engaged in the active practice 340 of practical nursing as a licensed practical nurse within five years immediately preceding 341 the application; provided, however, that the requirement for active practice shall not apply 342 to an applicant who has graduated from an approved nursing education program within one 343 year of the date of application or who was initially licensed within one year of the date of 344 application met continuing competency requirements as established by the board.

(b) The board, at its discretion, may issue a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse,
with examination, to any person who has a high school diploma or general educational
development (GED) diploma and has been duly licensed or registered as a practical or
vocational nurse or who is entitled to perform similar service under a different designation

349 under the laws of another state or territory of the United States if the license or registration 350 in that other state or territory is current and in good standing and was issued based upon 351 completion of an approved nursing education program, as defined in Code Section 43-26-32, except however, such applicant has not been duly examined according to the 352 353 prescribed examination approved by this board and if such person has engaged in active 354 practice of practical nursing as a licensed practical nurse within five years immediately 355 preceding the application meets continuing competency requirements as established by the 356 board.

357 (c) Applicants for endorsement who have not been engaged in the active practice of
358 practical nursing as licensed practical nurses for a period which exceeds five years a period
359 of time established by the board shall be required to complete additional education and
360 training as provided in the rules and regulations of the board, which may include but not
361 be limited to returning to school for full training and taking the licensing examination.

(d) The approval or denial of a license by endorsement under this Code section shall be
in the sole discretion of the board, and a denial thereof shall not be considered to be a
contested case within the meaning of Chapter 13 of Title 50, the 'Georgia Administrative
Procedure Act.' The applicant shall be allowed to appear before the board if the applicant
so desires.

367 (e) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to prevent an applicant who is denied
368 a license by endorsement from taking the examination for licensure, provided that such
369 applicant is otherwise eligible to take the examination and meets the requirements
370 specified.

(f) The board may issue a temporary permit to qualified applicants under such terms and
conditions as specified in the rules and regulations of the board, but in no event shall such
a temporary permit be issued to an applicant who has failed to pass the required
examination."

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SECTION 7.

Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 43-26-39, relating to license
renewal, voluntary surrender, application for reinstatement, and temporary permits, as
follows:

379 *"*43-26-39.

(a) Licenses issued under this article shall be renewed biennially prior to the expiration of
the license according to schedules and fees decided by the board and approved by the
division director.

383 (b) A license shall be renewed for any licensed practical nurse who remits the required fee

and complies with the requirements established by the board.

(b.1) Beginning with the 2016 2017 license renewal cycle, an applicant for license renewal
under this article shall meet one of the following continuing competency requirements
during the previous licensure period:

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(1) Completion of 20 continuing education hours by a board approved provider; or

389 (2) Completion of an accredited academic program of study in registered professional390 nursing, as recognized by the board.

Failure to meet the minimum continuing competency requirement for renewal of a license shall be grounds for denial of a renewal application. The board may waive or modify the requirements contained in this subsection in cases of hardship, disability, or illness or under such other circumstances as the board, in its discretion, deems appropriate. An applicant who is renewing a license for the first time shall not be required to meet the requirements of this subsection until the time of the second renewal if the applicant's initial license period is six months or less.

398 (c) The voluntary surrender of a license or the failure to renew a license by the end of an 399 established renewal period shall have the same effect as revocation of said license, subject to reinstatement at the discretion of the board. The board may restore and reissue a license 400 401 and, as a condition thereof, may impose any disciplinary sanction provided by Code 402 Section 43-1-19 upon such grounds as specified in Code Sections 43-1-19 and 43-26-40. 403 (d) Any license that is not renewed by the end of the renewal period may not thereafter be 404 renewed, and the licensee must apply for reinstatement. Applicants for reinstatement who 405 have not been engaged in the active practice of practical nursing as licensed practical 406 nurses for a period which exceeds five years shall be required to obtain such additional 407 education and training as provided in the rules and regulations of the board, which may 408 include, but not be limited to, returning to school for full training and taking the licensing 409 examination. Upon completion of the program, an application may be made for licensure 410 as a new applicant shall meet continuing competency requirements as established by the 411 board. (e) The board may issue a temporary permit to qualified applicants under such terms and 412 conditions as specified in the rules and regulations of the board, but in no event shall such 413

414 a temporary permit be issued to an applicant who has failed to pass the required 415 examination.

- 416 (f) Other criteria for reinstatement may be determined by the rules of the board, including,
- 417 but not limited to, additional coursework, a refresher course, supervised clinical practice,
- 418 or examination by the board."

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SECTION 8.

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420 Said chapter is further amended by revising paragraph (6) of subsection (a) of Code Section
421 43-26-40, relating to refusal to grant license, revocation of license, and disciplining of
422 licensees, as follows:

423 "(6) Displayed an inability to practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse or graduate
424 practical nurse with reasonable skill and safety due to illness, use of alcohol, drugs,
425 narcotics, chemicals, or any other types of material, or as a result of any mental or
426 physical condition:

427 (A) In enforcement of this paragraph, the board may, upon reasonable grounds, require 428 a licensee or applicant to submit to a mental or physical examination by a board approved health care professional. The expense of such mental or physical examination 429 430 shall be borne by the licensee or applicant. The results of such examination shall be 431 admissible in any hearing before the board, notwithstanding any claim of privilege under contrary law or rule. Every person who is licensed to practice practical nursing 432 433 as a licensed practical nurse or graduate practical nurse in this state, or an applicant for 434 examination, endorsement, or reinstatement, shall be deemed to have given such person's consent to submit to such mental or physical examination and to have waived 435 436 all objections to the admissibility of the results in any hearing before the board upon the 437 grounds that the same constitutes a privileged communication. If a licensee or applicant fails to submit to such an examination when properly directed to do so by the 438 439 board, unless such failure was due to circumstances beyond that person's control, the 440 board may enter a final order upon proper notice, hearing, and proof of such refusal. 441 Any licensee or applicant who is prohibited from practicing under this paragraph shall 442 at reasonable intervals be afforded an opportunity to demonstrate to the board that such 443 person can resume or begin to practice practical nursing as a licensed practical nurse 444 or graduate practical nurse with reasonable skill and safety; and

445 (B) In enforcement of this paragraph, the board may, upon reasonable grounds, obtain any and all records relating to the mental or physical condition of a licensee or 446 447 applicant, including psychiatric records; such records shall be admissible in any hearing before the board, notwithstanding any privilege under a contrary rule, law, or statute. 448 Every person who is licensed in this state or who shall file an application for said 449 450 license shall be deemed to have given such person's consent to the board's obtaining 451 such records and to have waived all objections to the admissibility of such records in any hearing before the board upon the grounds that the same constitute a privileged 452 communication." 453

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454	SECTION 9.
455	Said chapter is further amended by revising paragraph (4) of Code Section 43-26-42, relating
456	to criminal violations, as follows:
457	"(4) Use any words, abbreviations, figures, letters, title, sign, card, or device implying
458	that such person is a licensed practical nurse or graduate practical nurse unless such
459	person is duly licensed to practice under the provisions of this article;"
460	SECTION 10.
461	This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
462	without such approval.

- 464 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
