A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 24, 2015, as "Community Health Centers Day"; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, federally qualified community health centers located in over 156 medically
- 4 underserved communities provide high quality primary and preventive health care to 500,000
- 5 people in the State of Georgia, including over 150,000 Medicaid recipients and 225,000
- 6 uninsured, the working poor, and a large number of underinsured, elderly, homeless, and
- 7 other vulnerable populations, without regard to income status, cultural or ethnic heritage, or
- 8 disease conditions; and
- 9 WHEREAS, community health centers add \$375 million per year to Georgia's economy
- 10 through indirect and induced economic activity, including \$150 million in household income
- and 2,900 Georgia jobs, that saves the Georgia Medicaid program up to 33 percent in annual
- 12 spending per Medicaid beneficiary; and
- 13 WHEREAS, community health centers recruit and retain over 1,350 health care professionals
- 14 where they are most needed and offer access to a wide range of cost-effective medical and
- dental services, behavioral health services, prescription medicines, health education, nutrition
- 16 counseling, translation services, community outreach, transportation, and other support
- 17 programs; and
- 18 WHEREAS, community health centers have a track record spanning over four decades of
- 19 controlling costs, documented in several studies which show that rates of costly emergency
- 20 room visits, hospitalizations, and specialty care referrals are much lower among health center
- 21 patients than patients of other providers; and
- 22 WHEREAS, community health centers work in partnership with other health care providers,
- 23 local hospitals, health departments, social service agencies, and health related support

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24 services to maximize resources and assure that services are coordinated to improve the health

- 25 status of the community; and
- 26 WHEREAS, community health centers have been innovators in the establishment of patient
- 27 centered medical homes, providing access to quality care and continuity of care for the
- 28 patients they serve; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Georgia's community health centers and their state organization, the Georgia
- 30 Association for Primary Health Care, have worked diligently to increase the number of
- 31 community health centers in Georgia and have taken a leadership role in establishing more
- 32 centers in underserved communities to help resolve this state's health care access problems,
- 33 demonstrating commendable efforts in continuous quality improvement, reduction of health
- 34 disparities among the underserved, the implementation of new health care initiatives such as
- 35 health services integration, and utilization of the latest technology to improve both operations
- and delivery of services to more Georgians; and
- 37 WHEREAS, community health centers deserve commendation for their valuable
- 38 contributions in expanding access to health care, their outstanding record of service, and their
- 39 dedication to improving health care and the health status of all Georgians.
- 40 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 41 recognize February 24, 2015, as "Community Health Centers Day."
- 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 43 to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to the Georgia
- 44 Association for Primary Health Care.
