#### A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life and memory of Mr. James Howard "Bud" Holloway, Jr., and dedicating  
2 a bridge in his honor; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Mr. James Howard "Bud" Holloway, Jr., was born in Atlanta, Georgia, on July  
4 2, 1932, the beloved son of James Howard Holloway, Sr., and Louise Walton Holloway; and

5 WHEREAS, he served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty with the United  
6 States Navy, valiantly and courageously defending his fellow citizens and upholding the  
7 ideals of America; and

8 WHEREAS, in 1967, Mr. Holloway became the owner of the Pink Pig, a BBQ restaurant in  
9 the community of Cherry Log; and

10 WHEREAS, a cherished member of the Cherry Log community, Mr. Holloway always had  
11 a gold dollar for the children dining at his restaurant and a funny story to tell his guests; and

12 WHEREAS, Mr. Holloway will long be remembered for his sense of humor and quick wit,  
13 and his political debates continue to be sorely missed by those who loved him; and

14 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the extraordinary accomplishments of  
15 this distinguished Georgian be appropriately recognized by dedicating a bridge in his  
16 memory.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL  
18 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that the bridge on State Route 515 over Cherry Log Street in  
19 Gilmer County is dedicated as the J. H. "Bud" Holloway Memorial Bridge.

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and  
21 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the J. H. "Bud" Holloway  
22 Memorial Bridge.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
24 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the  
25 family of Mr. James Howard "Bud" Holloway, Jr., and to the Department of Transportation.
