#### A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life and memory of Mr. Henry Carlton Floyd and dedicating a road in his  
2 memory; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Mr. Henry Carlton Floyd has long been recognized by the citizens of this state  
4 for the vital role that he played in leadership and his deep personal commitment to the  
5 welfare of the citizens of Georgia; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd was born on March 11, 1940, in Royston, Georgia, the beloved son  
7 of Louise Carlton Floyd and Grady Floyd; and

8 WHEREAS, he earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Georgia and was the owner  
9 and operator of Ladds Farm Supply; and

10 WHEREAS, a man of deep and abiding faith, Mr. Floyd was an active member of Euharlee  
11 Baptist Church where he attended the adult Sunday school class and served as trustee and  
12 maintenance and grounds director; and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd served with honor and distinction on the Euharlee Farmer's Club and  
14 the Kiwanis Club, and his leadership was instrumental to the board of directors for the  
15 Cartersville-Bartow County Airport Authority; and

16 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the extraordinary accomplishments of  
17 this distinguished Georgian be appropriately recognized by dedicating a road in his memory.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL  
19 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that Ga. 133 from its intersection at Doughtit Ferry Road to  
20 Euharlee (Chulio) Road west of downtown Cartersville in Bartow County is dedicated as the  
21 Henry C. Floyd Memorial Highway.

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and  
23 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the Henry C. Floyd Memorial  
24 Highway.

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
26 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the  
27 family of Mr. Henry Carlton Floyd and to the Department of Transportation.
