7 collected turpentine in Gum Pond while they were children, wrote her Madison High School
8 Class Song, and composed the Albany State University Alma Mater; and
- 9 WHEREAS, she earned her Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education from Albany State
10 University and her Master's Degree in Early Childhood Education from New York University
11 before teaching school for more than 35 years in Mitchell and Decatur Counties in Georgia;

- 13 WHEREAS, Gladys Ward Sapp was united in love and marriage to John A. McCullough,
14 and was blessed with four remarkable children, Rycha, Janice, John, Jr., and Linda; and
- 15 WHEREAS, she married Hope Sapp in 1977 and helped parent Lillian, Vahishtean, and
16 Lamar, and she was blessed with 18 amazing grandchildren and 31 exceptional
17 great-grandchildren; and
- 18 WHEREAS, she gave inspiration to many through her high ideals, morals, and deep concern
19 for her fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding she demonstrated to
20 her family and friends were admired by others; and

21 WHEREAS, she was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation
22 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example she made of her life,
23 she made this world a better place in which to live; and

24 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous woman, Gladys Ward Sapp will long be
25 remembered for her love of family and friendship, and this loyal wife, mother, and friend will
26 be missed by all who had the great fortune of knowing her.
