- WHEREAS, Colonel Crissey has served as a member of the Board of Directors of Partners
 Cooperative, Inc., Chairman of Distribution Cooperative, Inc., advisor to the Clayton County

- 38 WHEREAS, he served as a member of the Clayton County Archway Partnership Project
- 39 Executive Committee, where he was instrumental in establishing an additional Federally
- 40 Qualified Health Center to support the citizens of Clayton County; and

- 42 by the Atlanta Regional Commission; and
- WHEREAS, he was honored with the Al Dohany Award for Community Service by the
 Georgia Public Health Association and the Carl G. Rhodenizer Community Service Award
 and Life Time Achievement Award by the Clayton County Chamber of Commerce and was
 named a Top 100 Leader in Healthcare by the *Atlanta Business Chronicle*; and

 Army and the citizens of this state for more than 45 years, and it is abundantly fitting and
