

A RESOLUTION

1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to authorize the General Assembly to  
 2 provide by law for dedication of certain existing fees and assessments for the purpose of  
 3 funding driver education and training courses in public schools with grades nine through 12;  
 4 to provide that such funds shall not be subject to lapse; to provide for the submission of this  
 5 amendment for ratification or rejection; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI of the Constitution is amended by adding a new  
 9 subparagraph (o) to read as follows:

10 "(o) The General Assembly may provide by general law that certain existing fees and  
 11 assessments be dedicated for the purpose of funding driver education and training courses  
 12 in public schools with grades nine through 12. Revenues dedicated pursuant to this  
 13 subparagraph shall not lapse as required by Article III, Section IX, Paragraph IV(c) and  
 14 shall not be subject to the limitations of subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph or of Article  
 15 VII, Section III, Paragraph II."

16 **SECTION 2.**

17 The above proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be published and submitted as  
 18 provided in Article X, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution. The ballot submitting the  
 19 above proposed amendment shall have written or printed thereon the following:

20 "( ) YES Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to authorize the General  
 21 Assembly to provide by law that certain existing fees and assessments be  
 22 ( ) NO dedicated for funding driver education and training courses in public schools  
 23 with grades nine through 12?"

24 All persons desiring to vote in favor of ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "Yes."

25 All persons desiring to vote against ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "No." If

26 such amendment shall be ratified as provided in said Paragraph of the Constitution, it shall  
27 become a part of the Constitution of this state.
