A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending the State YMCA of Georgia and its Center for Civic
2 Engagement and "Y" Club programs which sponsor Youth Assembly among other programs
3 that cultivate youth civic engagement; and for other purposes.

4 WHEREAS, the State YMCA of Georgia's Youth Assembly is a model state legislature for
5 high school students in which students serve as legislators, justices, attorneys, and lobbyists;
6 and

7 WHEREAS, participants in the Youth Assembly may run for the offices of Youth Governor,
8 Lt. Governor, and Speaker of the House; and

9 WHEREAS, students participating in the Youth Assembly are also given the opportunity to
10 explore the role that the media plays in government by participating in the production of a
11 daily newspaper; and

12 WHEREAS, established in 1946, the Youth Assembly conference takes place in the historic
13 halls of the Georgia State Capitol, providing participants with an experience of a lifetime;
14 and

15 WHEREAS, this year, the Youth Assembly celebrates its 72nd anniversary, and the State
16 YMCA of Georgia celebrates more than 87 years of excellence and tradition; and

17 WHEREAS, the 71st Youth Assembly was made up of many bright and eager young leaders,
18 including Youth Governor Jackson Mitchell, Lt. Governor Chris Taylor, Speaker of the
19 House Isaac Ortiz, President Pro Tem. Sarah Rogers, Speaker Pro Tem. of the House Haven
20 Prevatt, Chief Justice Emma Adams, Associate Justice Mandolin Moody, Associate Justice
21 Kaitlyn Malcom, Secretary of the Senate Zach Kennedy, Assistant Secretary of the Senate

30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
31 the members of this body commend the State YMCA of Georgia's Youth Assembly for 71
32 years of teaching Georgia's future leaders the legislative and state government process.
