A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Hi-Hope Service Center; and for other purposes.

- 2 WHEREAS, Hi-Hope Service Center was incorporated as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation
- 3 in 1960, founded by the parents of six young students from Gwinnett County as one of the
- 4 first organizations in Georgia to teach children with intellectual disabilities; and

5 WHEREAS, the construction of a special needs school was completed in 1970 under the 6 capable leadership of Mrs. Vinie Lowry and with support from many parents, the greater

7 Gwinnett Community, and the Gwinnett Jaycees; and

8 WHEREAS, Hi-Hope Service Center successfully transitioned to an organization supporting
9 developmentally disabled adults following the full integration of student programs into the
10 public schools; and

WHEREAS, Hi-Hope Service Center envisions a world where people with developmental
disabilities experience acceptance and inclusion as full community members; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Hi-Hope Service Center is to cultivate a community for
adults with developmental disabilities by providing integrated opportunities for learning,
work, and leisure; and

- WHEREAS, Hi-Hope Service Center currently runs a day program, an employment program,
 and a residential program supporting 114 adults with developmental disabilities, 20 of whom
 are group home residents and receive around the clock support; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Hi-Hope Service Center was awarded the Gwinnett County Parks and
- 20 Recreation Volunteer of the Year Award in 2006, the Gwinnett Chamber's D. Scott Hudgens,
- 21 Jr. Humanitarian Award in 2005 and the Pinnacle Small Business Award in 2011; and

- 22 WHEREAS, in 2015, Hi-Hope Service Center entered into a long-term joint management
- 23 agreement with The Enterline Foundation establishing a collaboration that further secures
- 24 the future for adults with developmental disabilities; and
- 25 WHEREAS, throughout its 56 years of service to the Gwinnett community, Hi-Hope Service
- 26 Center carries on its founders' legacy of compassion and innovation as an example to others
- 27 in the community; and
- 28 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this
- 29 remarkable and distinguished organization be appropriately recognized.
- 30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 31 the members of this body commend the Hi-Hope Service Center for their efficient, effective,
- 32 and dedicated public service to the State of Georgia.
- 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 34 and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to
- 35 Hi-Hope Service Center.
