A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 4 of Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to holidays and observances, so as to revise the public and legal holidays recognized by the State of Georgia; to prohibit the recognition of public and legal holidays honoring, recognizing, observing, or celebrating the Confederate States of America, its history, or the military or political leaders thereof or the Civil War; to repeal the observing of Confederate History and Heritage Month; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

Chapter 4 of Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to holidays and
observances, is amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 1-4-1, relating to public
and legal holidays and leave for observance of religious holidays not specifically provided
for, as follows:

- 14 "(a) The State of Georgia shall recognize and observe as public and legal holidays:
- (1) All days which have been designated as of January 1, 1984, as public and legalholidays by the federal government; and

(2) All other days designated and proclaimed by the Governor as public and legal
 holidays or as days of fasting and prayer or other religious observance. In such
 designation the Governor shall include at least one of the following dates: January 19,
 April 26, or June 3, or a suitable date in lieu thereof to commemorate the event or events
 now observed by such dates The Governor shall not designate or proclaim as public and
 legal holidays any days to honor, recognize, observe, or celebrate the Confederate States

23 of America, its history, or the military or political leaders thereof or the Civil War."

SECTION 2.

- 25 Said chapter is further amended by repealing and reserving Code Section 1-4-20, relating to
- 26 designation of Confederate History and Heritage Month.
