A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing January 31, 2016, as International Omphalocele Awareness Day; and for other

2 purposes.

WHEREAS, an omphalocele, which may be isolated or may be associated with other defects or chromosomal abnormalities, is a birth defect that occurs early in pregnancy in which the abdominal wall does not close properly, and some or most of the abdominal organs protrude into the umbilical cord; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that a small omphalocele occurs in about one out of every 5,000
pregnancies, and a large or giant omphalocele occurs in about one out of every 10,000
pregnancies; and

10 WHEREAS, despite the challenges a baby born with an omphalocele may face, many babies

11 who are born with an omphalocele survive and go on to live happy, healthy lives; and

12 WHEREAS, Mothers of Omphaloceles is a group of over 1,400 parents from around the

13 world that was created to provide hope and information to families with babies diagnosed

14 with an omphalocele; and

WHEREAS, Mothers of Omphaloceles is commended for its efforts to raise awareness thatthis defect is a treatable condition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
the members of this body recognize January 31, 2016, as International Omphalocele
Awareness Day.
