

## House Resolution 1239

## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Reverend Willie M. Bolden; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens  
3 with the passing of Reverend Willie Bolden; and
- 4 WHEREAS, he received his early education in the Savannah Public Schools and later  
5 graduated from Harvard University, with a Master of Education, and the Interdenominational  
6 Theological Center, with a certificate in Theology; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Reverend Bolden began his religious journey under the influence of Honorable  
8 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who convinced him to fight for equal rights with the Bible and  
9 a book written by Mahatma Gandhi; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Reverend Bolden began to work with Dr. King and worked in every major Civil  
11 Rights Movement across the country, including Selma, Alabama, and St. Augustine, Florida,  
12 which was the bloodiest movement of the entire 1960s; and
- 13 WHEREAS, he was in charge of bringing the Mule Train from Marx, Mississippi, to  
14 Washington, D.C., for the Poor People Campaign, and he organized 16 wagons and 50,000  
15 people for the 500 mile journey; and
- 16 WHEREAS, he continued his activism through speaking engagements, including a trip to  
17 Ferguson, Mississippi, to teach nonviolence; and
- 18 WHEREAS, he served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty with the United  
19 States Marine Corps, valiantly and courageously protecting his fellow Americans; and

20 WHEREAS, as a Union Representative with the American Federation of State, County, and  
21 Municipal Employees, Local 1644, he represented local membership in contract negotiations,  
22 and arbitration of employee grievances with supervisors and/or management; and

23 WHEREAS, Reverend Bolden served as pastor of the Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church  
24 in Cedartown, Georgia, for 14 years and the Pilgrim Missionary Baptist Church in Atlanta,  
25 Georgia, for four years; and

26 WHEREAS, highly regarded in his community, he was inducted into the International Civil  
27 Rights Hall of Fame by the Trumpet Award Foundation in 2012; presented an award for  
28 being a member of the "ground crew" that made the Civil Rights Movement in Savannah,  
29 Georgia, a success by the 50th Anniversary Celebration Committee in 2013; presented the  
30 Civil Rights Act of 1964 50th Anniversary Humanitarian Award by Corinth Missionary  
31 Baptist Church, Inc., in 2014; and was honored by Atlanta Mayor Kasim Reed as a Civil and  
32 Voting Rights Legend in 2015; and

33 WHEREAS, Reverend Bolden was united in love and marriage to Georgianna, and was  
34 blessed with one remarkable daughter, Felicia; and

35 WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern  
36 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his  
37 family and friends were admired by others; and

38 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation  
39 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example he made of his life, he  
40 made this world a better place in which to live; and

41 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Reverend Willie Bolden will long be  
42 remembered for his love of family and friendship, and this loyal activist, pastor, teacher, and  
43 friend will be missed by all who had the great fortune of knowing him.

44 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
45 the members of this body join in honoring the life and memory of Reverend Willie Bolden  
46 and express their deepest and most sincere regret at his passing.

47 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
48 and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to the  
49 family of Reverend Willie Bolden.
