- 4 WHEREAS, a woman of deep and abiding faith, she was an active member of Concord
5 Baptist Church, teaching Sunday school, serving as the church clerk, participating in all
6 Women's Missionary Union activities, and singing in the choir; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Mrs. Walls was united in love and marriage to Glyndon Walls and was blessed
8 with three remarkable children, Elaine, Danny, and Jenni; nine wonderful grandchildren,
9 Kristi, Steven, Kerri, Tony, Becca, David, Amanda, Daniel, and Todd; and seven amazing
10 great-grandchildren, Katie, Zachary, Hannah, Clay, Jaci, Kason, and Ally; and
- 11 WHEREAS, from a long line of Georgia educators, she began teaching at the age of 16 and
12 taught in some capacity until the age of 74, after which she served as a member of the
13 Dawson County Board of Education; and

15 classes; also taught adult literacy classes, helping adults learn to read and write; and helped
16 numerous students get their GEDs; and

18 for her fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding she demonstrated to
19 her family, friends, and students were admired by others; and
- 20 WHEREAS, she was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation
21 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example she made of her life,
22 she made this world a better place in which to live; and

23 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous woman, Mrs. Walls will long be remembered
