The House Committee on Governmental Affairs offers the following substitute to HR 900:

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Providing for delegates from the General Assembly of Georgia to the Assembly of State
- 2 Legislatures; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the Assembly of State Legislatures is a bipartisan group of currently serving
- 4 state legislators from across the country who recognize that the states have a responsibility
- 5 under federalism to work together to solve problems of national concern; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the mission of the Assembly of State Legislatures is to work together as states,
- 7 under the authority of Article V of the United States Constitution, to find solutions to the
- 8 problems of our country that are not being properly addressed by the federal government; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the Assembly's desire is to convene in a politically pure environment comprised
- only of state legislators. The intent of the framers of the Constitution of the United States was
- 11 to ensure the government derives its power from the will of the people, and this must be done
- 12 only through their elected state representatives and not special interest groups. No outside
- organization is allowed to be involved in any way in the Assembly; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the first step is to discuss and draft an agenda for a convention of the states for
- 15 the sole purpose of writing the rules that would govern any Article V conventions for
- 16 proposing amendments; and
- 17 WHEREAS, establishing such rules will:
- 18 (1) Cultivate the communication and interaction of state legislators, fostering a
- re-balance of power under our federal system; and
- 20 (2) Ensure that a prudent and cautious process is put in place to govern all future
- deliberations of the body; and
- 22 (3) Eliminate the distraction around the process of an Article V convention, thus
- 23 allowing Article V applications to be analyzed on the merits of its subject matter; and

24 WHEREAS, through this process the states will naturally begin discussions on possible

- 25 solutions, but it is only prudent to begin with putting rules and procedures in place that bring
- 26 transparent integrity to the process that was specifically left to the states by the founders of
- 27 this nation.
- 28 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 29 GEORGIA that there shall be a delegation from the General Assembly to the Assembly of
- 30 State Legislatures described above, which shall consist of six voting delegates and six
- 31 alternate delegates as follows:
- 32 (1) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members of the
- House of Representatives as voting delegates and two members of the House of
- Representatives as alternate delegates;
- 35 (2) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint two members of the Senate
- as voting delegates and two members of the Senate as alternate delegates;
- 37 (3) The leader of the minority party in the House of Representatives shall appoint one
- member of the House of Representatives as a voting delegate and one member of the
- 39 House of Representatives as an alternate delegate; and
- 40 (4) The leader of the minority party in the Senate shall appoint one member of the Senate
- as a voting delegate and one member of the Senate as an alternate delegate.
- 42 In no event shall more than four voting members of the General Assembly's delegation be
- 43 members of the same political party. All delegates shall serve for terms coinciding with their
- 44 terms as members of the General Assembly. Any vacancy in a position of delegate shall be
- 45 filled in the same manner as the original appointment. In the event a voting delegate is
- 46 temporarily unable to attend to his or her duties as such, the respective appointing authority
- 47 may designate an alternate delegate to act as a voting delegate until such time as the
- 48 temporary inability ceases.
