A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing February 22, 2016, as Clark Atlanta University Day at the state capitol; and for

2 other purposes.

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University (CAU) was established in 1988 upon the consolidation
of its two parent institutions Atlanta University and Clark College; and

5 WHEREAS, the University's four colleges offer 38 academic programs to roughly 4,000 6 students each year, a valuable contribution to the state's future workforce and leadership; and

WHEREAS, CAU hosts the Center for Cancer Research and Therapeutic Development and,
as such, is the only Historically Black Colleges and Universities member of the Georgia
Research Alliance and the nation's largest academic prostate cancer research center; and as
a result of its breakthrough research presently has five patents and patents pending; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University produces Jazz 91.9 FM-WCLK, the metro-Atlanta community's only jazz radio station, and a National Public Radio affiliate, which will be celebrating 41 years of service to the community this year; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University is the home of one of the nation's most prolific 14 15 undergraduate Mass Media Arts program, responsible for nurturing talent such as Sheldon "Spike" Lee, Nnegest Likke, Jacque Reed and Eva Marcille; the Center for Functional 16 Nanoscale Materials, the Center for Alternative Energy and Energy Conservation, the Center 17 for Biomedical and Bimolecular Research, and the Center for Cyberspace and Information 18 19 Assurance, all serving to advance the interest of boundaries of science, technology, innovation, and discovery in meaningful and profound ways; and the Center for Innovation 20 and Entrepreneurship Development, one of the nation's most progressive forums integrating 21 traditional academics, market research, intelligence, and innovation to increase 22 23 competitiveness among CAU graduates and local entrepreneurs; and

- 25 Kappa Phi, America's most prestigious honor society for all academic disciplines, in addition
- 26 to Golden Key International Honor Society, Phi Eta Sigma Honor Society, Alpha Kappa Mu
- 27 Honor Society, and several discipline-specific honor societies; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University is an important contributor to local, regional, and national communities, engaging more than 1,000 student and faculty volunteers annually in service to local nonprofit organizations, supporting the educational systems of Fulton, DeKalb, Cobb, Rockdale, and nearby counties, and continues to reach beyond the campus footprint to address critical issues through peaceful, educational means in communities stretching from Ferguson, Missouri, to Charleston, South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Clark Atlanta University has produced stellar alumni who constitute irreplaceable threads in the fabric of America, including: Ralph David Abernathy, Marva Collins, James Weldon Johnson, Kenny Leon, Lucy Craft Laney, Bomani Jones, Fletcher Henderson, and State Senators Horacena Tate and Vincent Fort, and is now under the leadership of its fourth President, Ronald A. Johnson, Ph.D., who is applying his considerable expertise, wisdom, and passion for students toward mobilizing for the future.
