A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing March 1, 2016, as Boy Scout Day at the state capitol; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, scouting evolved during the early 1900s through the efforts of several men
- 3 dedicated to bettering youth who conceived a program of outdoor activities that developed
- 4 skills in young boys and gave them a sense of enjoyment, fellowship, and a code of conduct
- 5 for everyday living; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Robert Stephenson Smyth Baden-Powell, First Baron Baden-Powell, known as
- 7 the founder of the Scouting Movement, wrote Scouting for Boys, which sparked the
- 8 formation of Scout troops across the world such that by 1922, there were more than a million
- 9 Scouts in 32 countries, and by 1939, the number of Scouts was in excess of 3.3 million; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the Boy Scouts of America endeavors to develop American citizens who are
- 11 physically, mentally, and emotionally fit; have a high degree of self-reliance as evidenced
- 12 in such qualities as initiative, courage, and resourcefulness; have personal values based on
- 13 religious concepts; have the desire and skills to help others; understand the principles of the
- 14 American social, economic, and governmental systems; are knowledgeable about and take
- pride in their American heritage and understand our nation's role in the world; have a keen
- 16 respect for the basic rights of all people; and are prepared to participate in and give
- 17 leadership to American society; and
- 18 WHEREAS, thousands of volunteer leaders across the United States, both men and women,
- 19 are involved in the Boy Scout program, serving in a variety of jobs, from unit leaders to
- 20 chairmen of troop committees and committee members, merit badge counselors, and
- 21 chartered organization representatives; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the Boy Scouts of America is the nation's foremost program of character
- 23 development and values based leadership training for youth, fostering the philosophy of duty

24 to God, country, and self and a commitment to others through a comprehensive program of

- 25 responsible fun, outdoor adventure, and service projects; and
- 26 WHEREAS, scouting has been an integral part of the lives of so many of our leaders and
- 27 men who have shaped America, such as George W. Bush, Dick Cheney, Sanford Bishop,
- 28 Sam Nunn, John Glenn, Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin, Jimmy Stewart, Jimmy Buffet, Henry
- 29 "Hank" Aaron, Bill Gates, Sr., Steven Spielberg, John Tesh, and James A. Lovell, Jr.; and
- 30 WHEREAS, the Georgia Boy Scout program is organized into 11 councils: Chehaw Council,
- 31 Georgia-Carolina Council, Chattahoochee Council, Flint River Council, Northeast Georgia
- 32 Council, Central Georgia Council, Northwest Georgia Council, Coastal Empire Council,
- 33 Alpha Area Council, Okefenokee Council, and Atlanta Area Council; and
- 34 WHEREAS, such a worthwhile program deserves respect, admiration, gratitude, and
- 35 commendation for the impact it has had and continues to have on the character of the youth
- 36 of this state and this nation.
- 37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 38 the members of this body commend the Boy Scouts of America for their many achievements
- 39 and contributions to the welfare of this state and recognize March 1, 2016, as Boy Scout Day
- 40 at the state capitol.
- 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 42 and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 43 Atlanta Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America.
