A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Subpart 1 of Part 3 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of
- 2 Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions regarding the Georgia Student Finance
- 3 Authority, so as to provide for voluntary donations through state income tax returns and
- 4 drivers' licenses for funding undergraduate tuition grants to children of law enforcement
- 5 officers, firefighters, emergency medical technicians, prison guards, and Highway
- 6 Emergency Response Operators of the Department of Transportation who were disabled or
- 7 killed in the line of duty; to provide for a short title; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 8 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

10 SECTION 1.

11 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Shawn Smiley Act."

12 SECTION 2.

- 13 Subpart 1 of Part 3 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 14 Annotated, relating to general provisions regarding the Georgia Student Finance Authority,
- 15 is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 16 "<u>20-3-316.2.</u>
- 17 (a)(1) Each Georgia income tax return form for taxable years beginning on or after
- January 1, 2017, shall contain appropriate language, to be determined by the state revenue
- commissioner, offering the taxpayer the opportunity to contribute to the Georgia Student
- 20 <u>Finance Authority to provide financial assistance toward the postsecondary educational</u>
- 21 costs of the children of law enforcement officers, firefighters, emergency medical
- 22 <u>technicians, and prison guards employed by the state or other public employer, and</u>
- 23 <u>Highway Emergency Response Operators of the Department of Transportation who were</u>
- 24 permanently disabled or killed in the line of duty by either donating all or any part of any
- 25 <u>tax refund due and authorizing a reduction in the refund check otherwise payable or</u>

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26 contributing any amount over and above any amount of tax owed by adding that amount 27 to the taxpayer's payment. The instructions accompanying the income tax return shall 28 include a description of the intended use of the moneys received from the contributions. 29 Each taxpayer required to file a state income tax return who desires to contribute to the 30 Georgia Student Finance Authority may designate such contribution as provided on the 31 appropriate income tax return form. 32 (2) The Department of Revenue shall determine annually the total amount so contributed 33 and shall transmit such amount to the Georgia Student Finance Authority. 34 (b) Beginning January 1, 2017, the Department of Driver Services shall, through 35 appropriate language on its forms for the issuance and renewal of drivers' licenses and 36 identification cards, offer individuals the opportunity to make voluntary contributions to 37 the Georgia Student Finance Authority to provide financial assistance toward the 38 postsecondary educational costs of the children of law enforcement officers, firefighters, 39 emergency medical technicians, and prison guards employed by the state or other public 40 employer, and Highway Emergency Response Operators of the Department of 41 Transportation who were permanently disabled or killed in the line of duty; provided, however, that such voluntary contributions shall be in whole dollar amounts. The form 42 43 shall contain a description of the intended use of moneys received from the contributions. 44 Each individual who desires to contribute may designate such contribution on the 45 appropriate form, and the Department of Driver Services shall accept such contribution. 46 The Department of Driver Services shall determine annually the total amount so 47 contributed, shall withhold therefrom a reasonable amount for administering this voluntary 48 contribution program, and shall transmit the balance to the Georgia Student Finance 49 Authority for funding, in whole or in part, the postsecondary educational costs of such students. If, in any tax year, the administrative costs of the Department of Driver Services 50 51 for collecting contributions pursuant to this subsection exceed the sum of such 52 contributions, the administrative costs which the Department of Driver Services is 53 authorized to withhold from such contributions shall not exceed the sum of such 54 contributions."

55 **SECTION 3.**

56 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
