A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending the Georgia Aquarium and recognizing the facility's ten-year anniversary; and
- 2 for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the Georgia Aquarium is a sensational economic driver for the City of Atlanta
- 4 and the State of Georgia, generating some \$2.3 billion in additional personal resources and
- 5 increasing the state's gross domestic product by \$1.9 billion; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the Georgia Aquarium is an outsized source of state and local revenue,
- 7 generating in excess of \$8 million in state and local sales and income taxes; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the Georgia Aquarium has become a world-class tourist destination as the
- 9 anchor of Atlanta's largest tourism district, annually attracting 2.2 million visitors, 60 percent
- of whom are out-of-state travelers, and contributing to a 38 percent room revenue growth in
- 11 the surrounding hotel district since 2005; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the Georgia Aquarium has been a catalyst for the revitalization of downtown
- 13 Atlanta, stimulating more than \$1.7 billion in new investment around Centennial Olympic
- 14 Park and supporting 11,165 construction jobs since groundbreaking; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the Georgia Aquarium is an unparalleled scholastic resource for Georgia
- 16 children, attracting more than one million student visitors in the facility's first decade; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the Georgia Aquarium is a major local employer, supporting 2,046 permanent
- jobs across Georgia in 2015 and a projected 2016 direct payroll of more than \$30 million;

- 20 WHEREAS, the Georgia General Assembly has been a partner in growth with the Aquarium
