A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Theodis A. Pace for the vital role he serves in community
2 leadership; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, as Chairman of Atlanta Neighborhood Planning Unit (NPU) I, Theodis A. Pace
4 has been active in the metropolitan community as an advocate for community development,
5 affordable housing, educational opportunities, public safety, and all other efforts to help
6 sustain neighborhoods and keep communities safe and viable places to live, work, and play;

8 WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta established an NPU system in 1974 to provide an
9 opportunity for people to actively participate in the comprehensive development plans for
10 the city's future as members of citizen advisory councils that make recommendations to the
11 mayor and city council on zoning, land use, and other planning issues so as to help make
12 decisions that best meet the needs of individual communities and the entire city; and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Pace is a board member of The Remarkable Youth Project, a non-profit
14 organization providing educational programs and opportunities focused on digital media arts
15 technology for young people interested in career paths in the film, music, and digital
16 entertainment industry; and

17 WHEREAS, he also contributes to the community as a member of the Peyton Forest
18 Elementary School Parent Teacher Association; Coach with the Sandtown Youth Sports
19 Association; member of the Morehouse College Alumni Association - Atlanta Chapter; and
20 the United Way of Metropolitan Atlanta, Inc. - Volunteer Involvement Program; and

21 WHEREAS, Mr. Pace has worked with the City of Atlanta for more than 13 years throughout
22 various departments as a paralegal, contracting officer, and contracts administrator and is
23 currently a legislative research and policy analyst with the city council; and

24 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this
25 distinguished and remarkable Georgian be appropriately recognized.

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
27 recognize Theodis A. Pace, commend him for his service to his community and state, and
28 extend to him their most sincere best wishes for continued success in all his future endeavors.
