A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Title 30 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to handicapped 2 persons, so as to provide for additional rights and responsibilities of persons with service 3 animals; to provide for accommodation of those requiring service animals; to authorize 4 creation and issuance of information cards under the auspices of the Department of Human 5 Services; to provide for criminal offenses and penalties relating to fraudulent representation relating to disability; to amend Part 1 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official 6 7 Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to criminal offenses relative to dangerous instrumentalities and practices generally, so as to provide for criminal offenses and penalties 8 9 related to the harassing, injuring, or killing of service animals; to provide for related matters; 10 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes. 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA: **SECTION 1.** 12 13 Title 30 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to handicapped persons, is 14 amended by revising Chapter 4, relating to rights of persons with disabilities, as follows: "CHAPTER 4 15 30-4-1. 16 17 As used in this chapter, the term: 18 (1) 'Housing accommodations' means any real property or portion thereof which is used 19 or occupied, or intended, arranged, or designed to be used or occupied, as the home, 20 residence, or sleeping place of one or more human beings but shall not include any single-family residence the occupants of which rent, lease, or furnish for compensation 21 22 not more than one room therein.

- (2) 'Major life activities' means those actions necessary to function effectively in society
 and shall include ambulating, seeing, hearing, learning, working, and interacting with
 others.
 (2)(3) 'Physically disabled or mentally impaired person' means any person, regardless of
 age, who is subject to is unable or substantially limited in his or her ability to perform one
- 28 <u>or more major life activities as a result of:</u>
- 29 (<u>A</u>) a <u>A</u> physiological defect or deficiency regardless of its cause, nature, or extent that
 30 renders the person unable to move about without the aid of crutches, a wheelchair, or
- 31 any other form of support, or that limits the person's functional ability to ambulate,
- 32 climb, descend, sit, rise, or to perform any related function.; or
- 33 (B) A mental or psychological disorder or illness.
- 34 (4) 'Service animal' means an animal that is trained or is actively being trained to assist,
- 35 do work, or perform tasks for a physically or mentally impaired person and which is
- 36 <u>actually utilized for the purpose of aiding such person in performing one or more major</u>
- 37 life activities; provided, however, that such term shall not include an animal solely
- 38 providing comfort, emotional support, or companionship.

40 (a) Blind persons, persons with visual disabilities, persons with physical disabilities, and deaf Physically or mentally impaired persons are entitled to full and equal 41 42 accommodations, advantages, facilities, and privileges on all common carriers, airplanes, 43 motor vehicles, railroad trains, motor buses, streetcars, boats, or any other public 44 conveyances or modes of transportation and at hotels, lodging places, places of public accommodation, amusement, or resort, and other places to which the general public is 45 46 invited, subject only to the conditions and limitations established by law and applicable 47 alike to all persons.

48 (b)(1) Every totally or partially blind physically or mentally impaired person shall have the right to be accompanied by a guide dog, and every physically disabled person and 49 50 every deaf person shall have the right to be accompanied by a service dog service animal, especially trained for the whenever necessary to perform its purpose, in any of the places 51 52 listed in subsection (a) of this Code section without being required to pay an extra charge 53 for the guide or service dog service animal; provided, however, that he or she any such person shall be liable for any damage done to the premises or facilities by such dog 54 service animal. In addition, if such totally or partially blind person, physically disabled 55 56 person, or deaf person is a student at a private or public school in this state, such person 57 he or she shall have the right to be accompanied by a guide dog or service dog service 58 animal, whenever necessary to perform its purpose, subject to liability for damage as

provided in the preceding sentence. The guide dog or service dog must be identified as
having been trained by a school for seeing eye, hearing, service, or guide dogs.

61 (2) Every person <u>actively</u> engaged in the training of a guide dog or service dog for the 62 purpose of accompanying a person as provided in paragraph (1) of this subsection service animal shall have the same right to be accompanied by such dog being trained as the 63 64 totally or partially blind person, deaf person, or physically disabled person has service 65 animal as a physically or mentally impaired person under paragraph (1) of this subsection, so long as such trainer is identified as the owner of such service animal or as 66 67 an agent or employee of a school for seeing eye, hearing, service, or guide dogs. training 68 service animals and:

69 (3) Every person engaged in the raising of a dog for training as a guide dog or service
70 dog for the purpose of accompanying a person as provided in paragraph (1) of this
71 subsection shall have the same right to be accompanied by such dog being raised for
72 training as the totally or partially blind person, deaf person, or physically disabled person
73 has under paragraph (1) of this subsection, so long as:

(A) Such dog is being held on a leash and service animal is under the control of the
 person raising such dog for an accredited school for seeing eye, hearing, service, or
 guide dogs trainer at all times, whether by physical restraint or command;

(B) Such person <u>The trainer</u> has on his or her person and available for inspection
 credentials from the accredited school for which the dog such service animal is being
 raised trained or proof of ownership of such service animal; and

80 (C) Such dog service animal is wearing a collar, leash, or other appropriate apparel or
 81 device that identifies such dog service animal with the accredited school for which such

82 dog it is being raised trained.

(c) Every totally or partially blind physically or mentally impaired person operating a
vending stand shall have the right to be accompanied by a trained guide dog service animal
on the entire premises of his or her vending operation.

87 (a) Blind persons, visually disabled persons, physically disabled persons, and deaf
88 Physically or mentally impaired persons shall be entitled to rent, lease, or purchase, as
89 other members of the general public, all housing accommodations offered for rent, lease,
90 or other compensation in this state, subject to the conditions and limitations established by
91 law and applicable alike to all persons.

92 (b) Every totally or partially blind person, every physically disabled person, and every deaf

93 physically or mentally impaired person who has a guide dog or service dog or who obtains

94 a guide dog or service dog <u>or obtains a service animal</u> and every person engaged in the

95 training of a guide dog or service dog service animal shall be entitled to full and equal

access to all housing accommodations provided for in this Code section, and he or she shall

97 not be required to pay extra compensation for such guide dog or service dog. However,

98 service animal; provided, however, that he or she shall be liable for any damage done to
99 the premises by such guide dog or service dog service animal.

100 (c) Nothing in this Code section shall require any person renting, leasing, or otherwise

101 providing real property for compensation to modify his or her property in any way or

102 provide a higher degree of care for a blind, visually disabled, physically disabled, or deaf

- 103 <u>physically or mentally impaired</u> person than for a person who is not so disabled.

105 (a) The Department of Human Services may authorize private service organizations that

106 provide assistance to physically or mentally impaired persons to create and issue

107 information cards containing the department's seal which briefly detail the rights of

108 physically or mentally impaired persons and the penalty for denial of, or interference with,

- 109 <u>such rights as follows:</u>
- 110 (1) The front side of such cards shall contain information identifying the owner of such

111 card. Such identifying information may include a photograph; and

112 (2) The reverse side of such cards shall contain the following language:

113 <u>'Under the laws of the State of Georgia, the rights of certain persons with physical or</u>

114 <u>mental impairments include the right of equal access to public accommodations and the</u>

115 <u>right to be accompanied by a service animal at all places of public accommodation, subject</u>

116 to limitations and conditions established by law. Denial of, or interference with, such

- 117 rights constitutes a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature punishable by a fine of
- 118 up to \$2,000.00, imprisonment for up to 30 days, or both.'
- 119 (b) The department may authorize private service organizations that provide assistance to
- 120 <u>disabled persons to create and issue information cards containing the department's seal</u>
- 121 which briefly detail the rights of persons training service animals and the penalty for denial
- 122 <u>of, or interference with, such rights as follows:</u>

123 (1) The front side of such cards shall contain information identifying the owner of such

- 124 card. Such identifying information may include a photograph; and
- 125 (2) The reverse side of such cards shall contain the following language:
- 126 <u>'Under the laws of the State of Georgia, the rights of certain persons who train service</u>
- 127 <u>animals include the right of equal access to public accommodations and the right to be</u>
- 128 accompanied by the service animal being trained at all places of public accommodation,
- 129 <u>subject to limitations and conditions established by law. Denial of, or interference with,</u>

- 130 <u>such rights constitutes a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature punishable by a fine</u>
- 131 of up to \$2,000.00, imprisonment for up to 30 days, or both.'
- 132 (c) The department shall promulgate such rules and regulations as necessary to implement
- 133 <u>this Code section.</u>

135 (a) Any person, firm, corporation, or the agent of any person, firm, or corporation who 136 denies or interferes with admittance to or enjoyment of the facilities enumerated in this 137 chapter or otherwise interferes with the rights of a totally or partially blind person, 138 physically disabled person, or deaf physically or mentally impaired person or person engaged in the training or raising of a guide dog or service dog service animal as provided 139 140 by this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature and, upon 141 conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$2,000.00, imprisonment for 142 not more than 30 days, or both. 143 (b) Any person who knowingly and willfully misrepresents himself or herself as qualified

144 <u>to use or train a service animal in order to obtain accommodation or secure rights under this</u>

145 <u>chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature and, upon</u>

146 <u>conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$2,000.00, imprisonment for</u>

- 147 <u>not more than 30 days, or both.</u>"

SECTION 2.

149 Part 1 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,

150 relating to criminal offenses relative to dangerous instrumentalities and practices generally,

151 is amended by revising Code Section 16-11-107.1, relating to harassment of assistance dogs,

152 as follows:

153 *"*16-11-107.1.

154 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:

155 (1) 'Assistance dog' means a dog that is or has been trained by a licensed or certified person, organization, or agency to perform physical tasks for a physically challenged 156 157 person. Assistance dogs include guide or leader dogs that guide individuals who are legally blind; hearing dogs that alert individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing to 158 159 specific sounds; and service dogs for individuals with disabilities other than blindness or 160 deafness, which are trained to perform a variety of physical tasks, including, but not 161 limited to, pulling a wheelchair, lending balance support, picking up dropped objects, or 162 providing assistance in a medical crisis. (2) 'Harass' means to engage in any conduct directed toward an assistance dog a service 163

164 <u>animal</u> that is knowingly likely to impede or interfere with the assistance dog's service

animal's performance of its duties or that places the blind, deaf, or physically limited
 person being served or assisted by the dog service animal in danger of injury.
 (3)(2) 'Notice' means an oral or otherwise communicated warning proscribing the
 behavior of another person and a request that the person stop the particular behavior.
 (3) 'Physical harm' means serious disfigurement or functional loss of limb or other body

171 (4) 'Service animal' shall have the same meaning as in Code Section 30-4-1.

(b) Any person who knowingly and intentionally harasses or attempts to harass an
assistance dog, knowing the dog to be an assistance dog, a service animal and who knows
or should know such animal to be a service animal shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and,
upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than 90 days or a
fine not to exceed \$500.00, or both.

177 (c) Any person who has continues to harass a service animal after having received notice that his or her behavior is interfering with the use of an assistance dog who continues to 178 179 knowingly and intentionally harass an assistance dog, knowing the dog to be an assistance dog, such service animal shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, 180 shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than 90 days or a fine not to exceed 181 182 \$500.00, or both, provided that any person who is convicted of a second or subsequent 183 violation of this subsection shall be punished as for a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature. 184

(d) Any person who knowingly and intentionally allows his or her dog to harass an
assistance dog, knowing the dog to be an assistance dog, a service animal and who knows
or should know such animal to be a service animal shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and,
upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than 90 days or a
fine not to exceed \$500.00, or both, provided that any person who is convicted of a second
or subsequent violation of this subsection shall be punished as for a misdemeanor of a high
and aggravated nature.

(e) Any person who knowingly and intentionally allows his or her dog to cause death or
physical harm to an assistance dog by rendering a part of the assistance dog's body useless
or by seriously disfiguring the assistance dog, knowing the dog to be an assistance dog, a
service animal and who knows or should know such animal to be a service animal shall be

- 196 punished as for a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature.
- 197 (f) Any person who intentionally destroys or causes physical harm to a service animal and
- 198 who knows or should know such animal to be a service animal shall be guilty of a felony
- 199 and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor
- 200 more than five years, a fine not to exceed \$10,000.00, or both. This subsection shall not
- 201 <u>apply to:</u>
