A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 8 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to solid waste management, so as to impose liability on any producer of coal ash who
- 3 disposes of such coal ash in this state in the event of a release; to provide for definitions; to
- 4 require financial security and testing measures; to provide for causes of action; to provide for
- 5 exceptions; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 2 of Chapter 8 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to solid
- 9 waste management, is amended by adding a new part to read as follows:

10 "Part 1A

- 11 <u>12-8-42.</u>
- 12 As used in this part, the term:
- (1) 'Coal combustion residuals' means any fly ash, bottom ash, or boiler slag generated
- as a result of the combustion of coal.
- 15 (2) 'Disposal site' means any physical location in this state for the final disposition of
- 16 <u>coal combustion residuals or the temporary storage or collection of coal combustion</u>
- 17 <u>residuals prior to reuse or recycling.</u>
- 18 (3) 'Originator' means any person who generates coal combustion residuals.
- 19 (4) 'Release' means spilling, leaking, emitting, discharging, escaping, leaching, or
- 20 <u>disposing into ground water or surface water.</u>

- 22 (a) No originator shall dispose of coal combustion residuals at any disposal site unless
- 23 <u>such originator owns at least \$100 million in assets in this state or has posted a surety bond</u>
- 24 with the department in an amount sufficient to cover any liability under this part.
- 25 (b) The division is authorized to require the testing of coal combustion residuals for toxic
- 26 <u>materials determined to be hazardous to public health and safety prior to disposal at any</u>
- 27 <u>disposal site.</u>
- 28 <u>12-8-44.</u>
- 29 (a) An originator who delivers or causes to be delivered any coal combustion residuals to
- 30 <u>any disposal site in this state shall be jointly and severally liable for damages resulting from</u>
- 31 any release of coal combustion residuals from such disposal site.
- 32 (b) Any person harmed by the release of coal combustion residuals or toxic components
- 33 thereof from a disposal site shall have a cause of action against any originator who
- 34 <u>disposed of any coal combustion residuals at such site in accordance with Chapter 9 of</u>
- 35 Title 51.
- 36 <u>12-8-45.</u>
- 37 This part shall not apply to any originator who disposes of its coal combustion residuals
- 38 <u>on property owned by such originator; provided, however, that nothing in this Code section</u>
- 39 <u>shall be construed to limit the duties or liability of any such originator with regard to other</u>
- 40 <u>applicable federal, state, or local law."</u>
- 41 SECTION 2.
- 42 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
