A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 25-4-9 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to basic
2 firefighter training courses and transfer of certification, so as to provide that military
3 firefighter training may be accepted as required basic training; to provide for related matters;
4 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 **SECTION 1.**

7 Code Section 25-4-9 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to basic firefighter
8 training courses and transfer of certification, is amended by revising subsection (a) as
9 follows:

10 "(a)(1) ~~Full-time~~, Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection,
11 full-time, part-time, and volunteer firefighters, including airport firefighters, shall
12 successfully complete a basic training course. The council shall determine the course
13 content, number of hours, and all other matters relative to basic firefighter training,
14 including airport rescue firefighter training. Upon satisfactory completion of such basic
15 training, a firefighter shall be issued a certificate of completion evidencing the same.
16 Each firefighter shall be required to successfully complete such basic training course
17 within 12 months after being employed or appointed as a firefighter or, in the case of
18 airport firefighters, within such time period as the council may prescribe by rule or
19 regulation.

20 (2) Each firefighter who presents to the council satisfactory documentation, as
21 determined by the council, of his or her training as a member of the United States armed
22 forces, the United States Coast Guard, the Georgia National Guard, or the Georgia Air
23 National Guard shall be issued a certificate of completion by the council."

24 **SECTION 2.**

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
