A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life of Mr. A. Frank Williams and dedicating a road in his honor; and for other
2 purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Mr. A. Frank Williams has long been recognized by the citizens of this state for
4 the vital role that he has played in leadership and his deep personal commitment to the
5 welfare of the citizens of Georgia; and

6 WHEREAS, he has diligently and conscientiously devoted innumerable hours of his time,
7 talents, and energy toward the betterment of his community and state as evidenced
8 dramatically by his 44 years of superlative service with the City of Hephzibah Commission;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, Mr. Williams' significant organizational and leadership talents, his remarkable
11 patience and diplomacy, his keen sense of vision, and his sensitivity to the needs of the
12 citizens of this state earned him the respect and admiration of his colleagues and associates;

14 WHEREAS, he is a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation for
15 integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness; and

16 WHEREAS, Mr. Williams served with honor and distinction with the City of Hephzibah
17 Commission, and his vision and unyielding commitment set the standard for public service;

19 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that this remarkable and distinguished
20 Georgian be recognized appropriately by dedicating a road in his honor.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL
22 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that the portion of Georgia Highway 88 within the City of
23 Hephzibah in Richmond County is dedicated as the A. Frank Williams Highway.

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and
25 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the A. Frank Williams Highway.

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
27 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to Mr. A. Frank
28 Williams and to the Department of Transportation.
