## Senate Bill 310

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to public utilities and 2 public transportation, so as to provide for a legislative purpose; to define certain terms; to 3 provide that any Internet service provider engaged in the provision of broadband Internet 4 access service shall publicly disclose accurate information regarding the network 5 management practices, performance, and commercial terms of its broadband Internet access 6 service; to prohibit any Internet service provider from blocking lawful content, applications, 7 services, and nonharmful devices; to prohibit unreasonable discrimination in transmitting 8 lawful network traffic over a consumer's broadband Internet access service; to provide for 9 the implementation of rules and regulations; to provide for penalties; to provide for related 10 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.
Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to public utilities and public
transportation, is amended by revising Chapter 10, which was previously reserved, as
follows:

## 17 46-10-1.

18 The purpose of this chapter is to preserve the Internet as an open platform enabling

19 consumer choice, freedom of expression, end user control, competition, and the freedom

- 20 <u>to innovate without permission</u>. Reserved.

- 22 As used in this chapter, the term:

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23	(1) 'Broadband' means wide bandwidth data transmission which transports multiple
24	signals and traffic types.
25	(2) 'Internet service provider' means a company having one or more access points from
26	one place to the rest of the Internet that provides individuals and other companies access
27	to the Internet and other related services.

29 An Internet service provider engaged in the provision of fixed or wireless broadband 30 Internet access service shall publicly disclose accurate information regarding the network 31 management practices, performance, and commercial terms of its broadband Internet 32 access service sufficient for consumers to make informed choices regarding the use of such 33 service and for content, application, service, and device providers to develop, market, and 34 maintain Internet offerings; provided, however, that this Code section shall not be 35 construed so as to require public disclosure of competitively sensitive information or 36 information that would compromise network security or undermine the efficacy of 37 reasonable network management practices. 38 <u>46-10-4.</u> 39 An Internet service provider engaged in the provision of fixed or wireless broadband 40 Internet access service, insofar as such Internet service provider is so engaged, shall not 41 block lawful content, applications, services, or nonharmful devices, subject to reasonable 42 network management. An Internet service provider engaged in the provision of mobile 43 broadband Internet access service, insofar as such Internet service provider is so engaged, 44 shall not block consumers from accessing lawful websites, subject to reasonable network 45 management, nor shall such Internet service provider block applications that compete with the provider's voice or video telephone services, subject to reasonable network 46

An Internet service provider engaged in the provision of fixed or wireless broadband
 Internet access service, insofar as such Internet service provider is so engaged, shall not
