4 Florida, Delia J. Brown; and

5 WHEREAS, Mr. Shelton went on to serve his country by joining the United States Air Force
6 and afterwards attended the Atlanta College of Mortuary Science, eventually working as a
7 mortician for Hanley Bell Street, Hanley Ashby Street, Hanley Company, and the United
8 States Postal Service; and

9 WHEREAS, he met and married the love of his life, Evelyn Sample Shelton, and they were
10 blessed with three amazing children, four wonderful grandchildren, and two outstanding
11 great-grandchildren; and

12 WHEREAS, Mr. Shelton and his wife purchased Hanley Company from Mr. and Mrs. D. H.
13 Holmes in 1969 and changed its name to Hanley-Shelton Funeral Directors in 1985;
14 eventually, the funeral home was relocated from Washington Avenue to 473 Lawrence
15 Street, Marietta, Georgia; and

16 WHEREAS, Mr. Shelton continues to serve and care for the grieving families of his
17 community with professional and dignified service, always with kind and caring words and
18 prayers for all; and

19 WHEREAS, his love is always on display through his generosity and love for God's people,
20 exemplified by his motto, "Love, love, love now"; and

21 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this
22 extraordinary citizen of Georgia be appropriately recognized.
