A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and  
2 businesses, so as to change provisions relating to professional land surveyors; to change and  
3 add certain defined terms; to provide for land surveyor interns; to change certain educational  
4 and examination requirements; to provide certain exceptions; to provide for applicability; to  
5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses,  
9 is amended by revising Chapter 15, relating to professional engineers and land surveyors, as  
10 follows:

11 "CHAPTER 15

12 43-15-1.

13 This chapter is enacted to safeguard life, health, and property and to promote the public  
14 welfare.

15 43-15-2.

16 As used in this chapter, the term:

17 (1) 'Board' means the State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land  
18 Surveyors created in subsection (a) of Code Section 43-15-3.

19 (2) 'Certificate' means any certificate issued under Code Section 43-15-8 or 43-15-12.

20 (3) 'Certificate of registration' means any certificate issued under Code Section 43-15-9;  
21 ~~43-15-13;~~ or 43-15-16.

22 (4) 'Current certificate of registration' means a certificate of registration which has not  
 23 expired or been revoked and the rights under which have not been suspended or otherwise  
 24 restricted by the board.

25 (5) 'Current license' means a license issued under Code Section 43-15-13 which has not  
 26 expired or been revoked and the rights under which have not been suspended or otherwise  
 27 restricted by the board.

28 ~~(5)~~(6) 'Engineer-in-training' means an individual who meets the qualifications for and  
 29 to whom the board has duly issued an engineer-in-training certificate.

30 ~~(6)~~(7) 'Land surveying' means any service, work, or practice, the adequate performance  
 31 of which requires the application of special knowledge of the principles of mathematics,  
 32 the related physical and applied sciences, and the requirements of relevant law in the  
 33 evaluation ~~and~~ or location of property rights, as applied to:

34 (A) Measuring and locating lines, angles, elevations, natural and manmade features in  
 35 the air, on the surface of the earth, in underground works, and on the beds of bodies of  
 36 water, for the purpose of determining and reporting positions, topography, areas, and  
 37 volumes;

38 (B) Establishing or reestablishing, locating or relocating, or setting or resetting of  
 39 monumentation for any property, easement, or right of way boundaries, or the boundary  
 40 of any estate or interest therein;

41 (C) The platting and layout of lands and subdivisions thereof, including alignment and  
 42 grades of streets and roads, excluding thoroughfares;

43 (D) The design, platting, and layout, incidental to subdivisions of any tract of land by  
 44 a land surveyor, of:

45 (i) Grading plans and site plans;

46 (ii) Erosion and sediment control plans, including detention ponds, provided that no  
 47 impoundment shall be designed on a live (perennial) stream; provided, further, that  
 48 such detention ponds:

49 (I) Contain no more than five acre-feet of water storage at maximum pool (top of  
 50 dam) or are no more than ten feet in height for a dry storage pond;

51 (II) Are no more than six feet in height for a permanent (wet) storage pond; or

52 (III) Contain no more than three acre-feet of water storage at maximum pool (top  
 53 of dam) if the height is more than ten feet but less than 13 feet for a dry storage  
 54 pond;

55 (iii) Storm water management plans and facilities, including hydrologic studies and  
 56 temporary sediment basins, provided that the contributing drainage area shall not be  
 57 larger than 100 acres; and

58 (iv) Extension of existing water distribution piping and gravity sewers, eight inches  
 59 in diameter or smaller, provided that off-site length shall not exceed 1,000 feet, the  
 60 design and construction of which shall conform to the local government ordinances  
 61 and regulations, and such extensions shall be subjected to the review and approval of  
 62 a local government which has been delegated approval authority by the  
 63 Environmental Protection Division of the Department of Natural Resources;,  
 64 provided that the design of any storm-water management plans, facilities, water  
 65 distribution lines, and sanitary sewer collection systems shall be performed only by  
 66 such professional land surveyors who are qualified to do so as provided in Code Section  
 67 43-15-13.1;

68 (E) Conducting horizontal and vertical control surveys, layout or stake-out of proposed  
 69 construction, or the preparation of as-built surveys which relate to property, easement,  
 70 or right of way boundaries;

71 (F) Utilization of measurement devices or systems, such as aerial photogrammetry,  
 72 geodetic positioning systems, land information systems, or similar technology for  
 73 evaluation or location of property, easement, or right of way boundaries; or

74 (G) The preparation and perpetuation of maps, record plats, drawings, exhibits, field  
 75 notes, or property descriptions representing these services.

76 ~~(7) 'Land surveyor' means an individual who is qualified to engage in the practice of land~~  
 77 ~~surveying and who possesses a current certificate of registration as a land surveyor issued~~  
 78 ~~by the board. A person shall be construed to practice or offer to practice land surveying~~  
 79 ~~within the meaning of this chapter who by verbal claim, sign, advertisement, letterhead,~~  
 80 ~~cards, or in any other way represents or holds himself or herself out as able or qualified~~  
 81 ~~to perform or who does perform any of the services defined as land surveying.~~

82 (8) 'Land ~~surveyor-in-training~~ surveyor intern' means an individual who meets the  
 83 qualifications for and to whom the board has duly issued a certificate as a land  
 84 surveyor-in-training.

85 (9) 'Person' means an individual ~~and~~ or any legal or commercial entity, including, by way  
 86 of illustration and not limitation, a partnership, corporation, association, or governmental  
 87 agency.

88 (10) 'Professional engineer' means an individual who is qualified, by reason of  
 89 knowledge of mathematics, the physical sciences, and the principles by which mechanical  
 90 properties of matter are made useful to ~~man~~ mankind in structures and machines, acquired  
 91 by professional education and practical experience, to engage in the practice of  
 92 professional engineering and who possesses a current certificate of registration as a  
 93 professional engineer issued by the board.

94 (11) 'Professional engineering' means the practice of the ~~art~~ arts and sciences, known as  
 95 engineering, by which mechanical properties of matter are made useful to ~~man~~ mankind  
 96 in structures and machines and shall include any professional service, such as  
 97 consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning, designing, or responsible supervision  
 98 of construction or operation, in connection with any public or private utilities, structures,  
 99 buildings, machines, equipment, processes, works, or projects, wherein the public welfare  
 100 or the safeguarding of life, health, or property is concerned or involved, when such  
 101 professional service requires the application of engineering principles and data and  
 102 training in the application of mathematical and physical sciences. ~~A person~~ An individual  
 103 shall be construed to practice or offer to practice professional engineering, within the  
 104 meaning of this chapter, who by verbal claim, sign, advertisement, letterhead, card, or in  
 105 any other way represents or holds himself or herself out as a professional engineer or  
 106 engineer or as able or qualified to perform engineering services or who ~~does perform~~  
 107 performs any of the services set out in this paragraph. Nothing contained in this chapter  
 108 shall include the work ordinarily performed by ~~persons~~ individuals who operate or  
 109 maintain machinery or equipment.

110 (12) 'Professional land surveyor' or 'land surveyor' means an individual who is qualified  
 111 to engage in the practice of land surveying and who possesses a current license as a  
 112 professional land surveyor issued by the board. An individual shall be construed to  
 113 practice or offer to practice land surveying within the meaning of this chapter who by  
 114 verbal claim, sign, advertisement, letterhead, cards, or in any other way represents or  
 115 holds himself or herself out as able or qualified to perform or who does perform land  
 116 surveying services.

117 43-15-3.

118 (a) A State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors is created  
 119 whose duty it shall be to administer this chapter.

120 (b) The board shall consist of six professional engineers, two professional land surveyors,  
 121 and a member appointed from the public at large who has no connection with the  
 122 professions of engineering and land surveying, all of whom shall be appointed by the  
 123 Governor for a term of five years. Of the professional engineers appointed to the board,  
 124 one shall be a structural engineer, one shall be a mechanical engineer, one shall be an  
 125 electrical engineer, two shall be civil or sanitary engineers, and one shall be from any  
 126 discipline of engineering. Each member of the board shall be a citizen of the United States  
 127 and a resident of this state.

128 (c) Each member shall hold office until his or her successor has been duly appointed and  
129 qualified. All successors shall be appointed in the same manner as the original  
130 appointment.

131 (d) A vacancy on the membership of the board shall be filled by appointment by the  
132 Governor, in the same manner as the original appointment to the position vacated, for the  
133 unexpired term.

134 (e) Professional engineers appointed to the board shall have been engaged in the practice  
135 of engineering in their respective disciplines for at least 12 years and shall have been in  
136 responsible charge of important engineering work in their respective disciplines for at least  
137 five years. ~~Land~~ Professional land surveyors appointed to the board shall have been  
138 engaged in the practice of land surveying for at least 12 years and shall have been in  
139 responsible charge of important land surveying work for at least five years. Responsible  
140 charge of engineering or land surveying teaching may be construed as responsible charge  
141 of important engineering or land surveying work, respectively.

142 (f) Each member of the board shall be reimbursed as provided for in subsection (f) of Code  
143 Section 43-1-2.

144 (g) The Governor may remove any member of the board for misconduct, incompetency,  
145 neglect of duty, or for any other sufficient and just cause.

146 43-15-4.

147 (a) The board shall adopt all necessary rules, regulations, and bylaws, not inconsistent with  
148 this chapter and the Constitution and laws of this state or of the United States, to govern  
149 its times and place of meetings for organization and reorganization, for the holding of  
150 examinations, for fixing the length of terms of its officers, and for governing all other  
151 matters requisite to the exercise of its powers, the performance of its duties, and the  
152 transaction of its businesses. The board shall adopt an official seal.

153 (b) The board shall meet at such times as the business of the board shall require, as the  
154 board or its chairman may determine, but shall hold one annual meeting each year at which  
155 time the board shall elect a chairman and a vice chairman.

156 (c) The board shall be assigned to the office of the division director for those purposes  
157 described in Chapter 1 of this title.

158 43-15-5.

159 The board shall keep records of its proceedings.

160 43-15-6.

161 (a) In carrying out this chapter, in addition to other powers conferred upon it under this  
162 chapter, the board shall have the power:

163 (1) To adopt and enforce regulations implementing this chapter, including regulations  
164 governing the professional conduct of those individuals registered by it;

165 (2) Under the hand of its chairman or his or her delegate and the seal of the board, to  
166 subpoena witnesses and compel their attendance and to require thereby the production of  
167 books, papers, documents, and other things relevant to such investigation in order to  
168 investigate conduct subject to regulation by the board; the chairman or the member of the  
169 board who is his or her delegate may administer oaths to witnesses appearing before the  
170 board; and the board may secure the enforcement of its subpoenas in the manner provided  
171 by Chapter 13 of Title 50, the 'Georgia Administrative Procedure Act'; and

172 (3) To maintain in its name an action for injunctive or other appropriate legal or  
173 equitable relief to remedy violations of this chapter and, in pursuing equitable remedies,  
174 it shall not be necessary that the board allege or prove that it has no adequate remedy at  
175 law.

176 (b) In addition to other powers conferred upon the board under this chapter, the board shall  
177 through rules and regulations require each ~~person~~ individual seeking renewal of a  
178 certificate of registration as a professional engineer or a license as a professional land  
179 surveyor to complete board approved continuing education of not more than 30 hours  
180 biennially for professional engineers and not more than 15 hours biennially for professional  
181 land surveyors. The board shall be authorized to approve courses offered by institutions  
182 of higher learning or offered by other institutions or organizations. The board shall  
183 randomly audit some applications for renewal of a certificate of registration or license to  
184 enforce compliance with this subsection. The continuing education requirements adopted  
185 by the board shall recognize the continuing education requirements imposed by other states  
186 to the extent that such continuing education courses meet the requirements imposed by the  
187 board. The board shall be authorized to waive the continuing education requirements in  
188 cases of hardship, disability, or illness or under such other circumstances as the board  
189 deems appropriate. The board shall waive the continuing education requirement for  
190 individuals over the age of 65 who have retired from active practice and who apply for an  
191 inactive license and for individuals over the age of 65 who are engaged in the active  
192 practice of their profession who have had a valid active license for the previous 25  
193 consecutive years. The requirement for continuing education including the exemptions  
194 provided for in this subsection shall apply to each licensing renewal cycle which begins  
195 after the 1996 renewal cycle.

196 43-15-7.

197 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person other than a professional engineer to practice or to  
198 offer to practice professional engineering in this state.

199 (b) It shall be unlawful for any person other than a professional land surveyor to practice  
200 or to offer to practice land surveying in this state.

201 43-15-8.

202 To be eligible for certification as an engineer-in-training, an applicant must meet the  
203 following minimum requirements:

204 (1)(A) Graduate in an engineering curriculum of not less than four years from a school  
205 or college approved by the board; and

206 (B) Pass a written examination in fundamental engineering subjects  
207 (engineer-in-training examination);

208 (2)(A) Graduate in an engineering curriculum of not less than four years or in a  
209 curriculum of four or more years in engineering technology or related science, from a  
210 school or college approved by the board; and

211 (B) Pass a written examination in fundamental engineering subjects  
212 (engineer-in-training examination); or

213 (3)(A) Acquire not less than eight years of experience in engineering work of a nature  
214 satisfactory to the board; and

215 (B) Pass a written examination in fundamental engineering subjects  
216 (engineer-in-training examination).

217 43-15-9.

218 To be eligible for a certificate of registration as a professional engineer, an applicant must  
219 meet the following minimum requirements:

220 (1)(A) Obtain certification by the board as an engineer-in-training under paragraph (1)  
221 of Code Section 43-15-8;

222 (B) Acquire a specific record of not less than four years' experience in engineering  
223 work of a character satisfactory to the board which indicates the applicant is competent  
224 to practice professional engineering; and

225 (C) Subsequently pass a written examination in the principles and practice of  
226 engineering (professional engineer's examination);

227 (2)(A) Obtain certification by the board as an engineer-in-training under paragraph (2)  
228 of Code Section 43-15-8;

229 (B) Acquire a specific record of not less than seven years' experience in engineering  
230 work of a character satisfactory to the board which indicates the applicant is competent  
231 to practice professional engineering; and

232 (C) Subsequently pass a written examination in the principles and practice of  
233 engineering (professional engineer's examination);

234 (3)(A) Obtain certification by the board as an engineer-in-training under paragraph (3)  
235 of Code Section 43-15-8;

236 (B) Acquire a specific record of not less than seven years' experience in engineering  
237 work of a character satisfactory to the board which indicates the applicant is competent  
238 to practice professional engineering; and

239 (C) Subsequently pass a written examination in the principles and practice of  
240 engineering (professional engineer's examination); or

241 (4)(A) Graduate in an engineering or related science curriculum of not less than four  
242 academic years;

243 (B) Acquire a specific record of not less than 16 years' experience in engineering work,  
244 of which at least eight years have been in responsible charge of important engineering  
245 work of a character satisfactory to the board, which indicates the applicant is competent  
246 to practice professional engineering; and

247 (C) Subsequently pass a written examination in the principles and practice of  
248 engineering (professional engineer's examination).

249 43-15-10.

250 (a) For the purpose of determining whether an applicant has acquired the experience  
251 required under Code Section 43-15-8 or 43-15-9:

252 (1) Responsible charge of engineering teaching may, in the board's sole discretion, be  
253 considered as responsible charge of engineering work;

254 (2) The satisfactory completion of each academic year of an approved course in  
255 engineering or engineering technology in a school or college approved by the board,  
256 without graduation, may be considered as equivalent to a year of engineering experience;

257 (3) Partial credit may be granted by the board for the successful completion of one or  
258 more scholastic years of a four-year engineering curriculum in a school or college not  
259 approved by the board or in a curriculum in related science in a school or college  
260 approved by the board. The degree of credit shall be determined by the board upon  
261 consideration of the mathematics, science, and engineering courses completed by the  
262 applicant;

263 (4) No applicant shall receive experience credit for more than four years of  
264 undergraduate education; and



265 (5) The satisfactory completion of graduate study in an approved engineering curriculum  
 266 may, in the board's sole discretion, be credited for not more than one year's experience.  
 267 (b) The execution, as a contractor, of work designed by a professional engineer or the  
 268 supervision of the construction of such work as foreman, inspector, or superintendent shall  
 269 not be deemed to be engineering experience unless such work involves the application of  
 270 engineering principles and the applicant presents evidence of additional engineering  
 271 experience of a character satisfactory to the board and indicating the applicant is competent  
 272 to be placed in responsible charge of engineering work.

273 43-15-11.

274 An applicant for the professional engineer's examination shall designate the special branch  
 275 of engineering in which the applicant proposes to engage. The scope of the professional  
 276 engineer's examination administered to him or her shall be prescribed by the board with  
 277 respect to that branch of engineering, with special reference to the applicant's ability to  
 278 design and supervise engineering work so as to ensure the safety of life, health, and  
 279 property.

280 43-15-12.

281 (a) To be eligible for certification as a land ~~surveyor-in-training~~ surveyor intern, an  
 282 applicant must meet the following minimum requirements:

- 283 (1)(A) Earn a bachelor's degree in a curriculum approved by the board;  
 284 (B) Earn an associate degree, or its equivalent, in a curriculum approved by the board  
 285 and acquire not less than two years of combined office and field experience in land  
 286 surveying of a nature satisfactory to the board; or  
 287 (C) Earn a high school diploma, or its equivalent, and acquire not less than four years'  
 288 experience in land surveying of a nature satisfactory to the board;
- 289 (2) Acquire a minimum of ~~15 quarter hours'~~ 18 semester hours of credit, or its equivalent,  
 290 in land surveying subjects in a course of study approved by the board; ~~provided, however,~~  
 291 ~~that on and after January 1, 1995, the minimum requirement shall be 20 quarter hours'~~  
 292 ~~credit, five of which shall be in hydrology; and~~
- 293 (3) Subsequently pass the board approved examination in the fundamentals of land  
 294 surveying (land ~~surveyor-in-training~~ surveyor intern examination).

295 (b) Land surveyor intern applicants may apply prior to July 1, 2020, with 15 quarter hours  
 296 of credit in land surveying subjects in a course of study approved by the board and five  
 297 quarter hours in hydrology. Such applicants applying prior to July 1, 2020, who meet the  
 298 requirements of this subsection shall be eligible for licensure without the hydrology exam.

299 43-15-13.

300 To be eligible for a ~~certificate of registration~~ license as a professional land surveyor, an  
301 applicant must meet the following minimum requirements:

302 (1)(A) Obtain certification as a land ~~surveyor-in-training~~ surveyor intern under  
303 subparagraph (A) of paragraph (1) and paragraph (3) of subsection (a) of Code  
304 Section 43-15-12;

305 (B) Acquire a specific record of the equivalent of not less than four years of combined  
306 office and field experience in land surveying with a minimum of three years' experience  
307 in responsible charge of land surveying projects under the supervision of a ~~registered~~  
308 professional land surveyor or such other supervision deemed by the board to be the  
309 equivalent thereof; and

310 (C) Subsequently pass a written examination on the principles and practices of land  
311 surveying and the laws of this state relating to land surveying (professional land  
312 surveyor examination);

313 (2)(A) Obtain certification as a land ~~surveyor-in-training~~ surveyor intern under  
314 subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) and paragraph (3) of subsection (a) of Code  
315 Section 43-15-12;

316 (B) Acquire an additional specific record of the equivalent of not less than four years  
317 of combined office and field experience in land surveying which, together with the  
318 qualifying experience under subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of  
319 Code Section 43-15-12, includes not less than four years' experience in responsible  
320 charge of land surveying projects under the supervision of a ~~registered~~ professional land  
321 surveyor or such other supervision deemed by the board to be the equivalent thereof;  
322 and

323 (C) Subsequently pass a written examination on the principles and practices of land  
324 surveying and the laws of Georgia relating to land surveying (professional land  
325 surveyor examination); or

326 (3)(A) Obtain certification as a land ~~surveyor-in-training~~ surveyor intern under  
327 subparagraph (C) of paragraph (1) and paragraph (3) of subsection (a) of Code  
328 Section 43-15-12;

329 (B) Acquire an additional specific record of not less than four years of experience in  
330 land surveying which, together with the qualifying experience under subparagraph (C)  
331 of paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of Code Section 43-15-12, includes not less than six  
332 years' experience in responsible charge of land surveying projects under the supervision  
333 of a ~~registered~~ professional land surveyor or such other supervision deemed by the  
334 board to be the equivalent thereof and of a grade and character satisfactory to the board  
335 indicating that the applicant is competent to practice land surveying; and

336 (C) Subsequently pass a written examination on the principles and practices of land  
 337 surveying and laws of this state relating to land surveying (professional land surveyor  
 338 examination).

339 43-15-13.1.

340 For an individual to be eligible to engage in the practices described in divisions (7)(D)(ii)  
 341 through (iv) of Code Section 43-15-2, he or she shall:

342 (1) Obtain licensure as a land surveyor or professional land surveyor under this chapter  
 343 prior to July 1, 2018; or

344 (2) Complete an additional three semester hours of coursework in hydrology, possess the  
 345 requisite required by the board, and pass the hydrology exam. The licensing record for  
 346 such individual as available to the public shall be marked as 'hydrology and design  
 347 authorized.'

348 43-15-14.

349 Board approval of an applicant for examination entitles the applicant to admission to the  
 350 next four consecutive examination offerings without reapplication. Following the first  
 351 offering to which the applicant is entitled to admission, the applicant shall not be admitted  
 352 to any of the succeeding three examination offerings except upon payment of a fee for each  
 353 examination, to be determined by the board. Admission to any future examinations will  
 354 be at the discretion of the board which may require the applicant to file a new application.  
 355 An examination offering occurs regardless of whether the applicant attends.

356 43-15-15.

357 (a) Applications for certificates ~~and for~~, certificates of registration, and licenses shall be  
 358 made under oath to the board and shall contain such information in the form and manner  
 359 as shall be prescribed by the board. The application shall be accompanied by a fee in an  
 360 amount prescribed by the board.

361 (b) No individual shall be eligible for a certificate ~~or~~, a certificate of registration, or a  
 362 license under this chapter who is not of good character and reputation.

363 (c) If the board denies an application on the ground that the applicant lacks the requisite  
 364 experience to admit him or her to the examination, the board may impose on the applicant  
 365 a period of deferment on the filing of a new application, during which period the board  
 366 shall not be required to accept for filing a new application by the applicant. The period of  
 367 deferment shall not exceed the time reasonably required to acquire the requisite experience.

368 (d) An application shall contain the names of not less than five ~~persons~~ individuals, not  
 369 related to the applicant by blood or marriage, of whom at least three shall be professional

370 engineers or professional land surveyors having personal knowledge of the experience on  
 371 which the applicant predicates his or her qualifications.

372 (e) Experience required under this chapter shall be of a character and nature approved by  
 373 the board and consistent with the purposes of this chapter.

374 43-15-16.

375 (a) The board may, in its discretion, upon application therefor and the payment of a fee  
 376 prescribed by the board, issue a certificate of registration as a professional engineer to any  
 377 individual who holds a certificate of qualification or registration issued to him or her by  
 378 proper authority of the National Council of Engineering Examiners or of any state or  
 379 territory or possession of the United States if the requirements of the registration of  
 380 professional engineers under which the certificate of qualification or registration was issued  
 381 do not conflict with this chapter and are of a standard not lower than that specified in this  
 382 chapter or if the applicant held such certificate on or before July 1, 1956. The fact that the  
 383 statute under which the individual was issued a certificate of qualification or registration  
 384 in another state does not provide that the required written examination be passed  
 385 subsequent to the acquisition of the required experience shall not be deemed as a conflict  
 386 with, or lower than, the Georgia requirements, provided that the written examination and  
 387 the amount of experience required for registration are substantially equivalent to the  
 388 Georgia requirements.

389 (b) The board may, in its discretion, upon application therefor and the payment of a fee  
 390 prescribed by the board, issue a ~~certificate of registration~~ license as a professional land  
 391 surveyor to any ~~person~~ individual who holds a ~~certificate of registration~~ license to practice  
 392 land surveying issued by a state or territory or possession of the United States obtained:

393 (1) By written examination of not less than eight hours in duration prior to July 1, 1968;
