A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 11 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to taxes
2 on tobacco products, so as to provide for the issuance of special event tobacco permits to
3 licensed dealers authorizing off-premise sales of certain tobacco products at special events
4 or temporary locations; to provide for such permits a fee and limitations as to the validity
5 period; to provide for the promulgation of certain rules and regulations by the state revenue
6 commissioner; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal
7 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

10 Chapter 11 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to taxes on
11 tobacco products, is amended in subsection (c) of Code Section 48-11-4, relating to licensing
12 of persons engaged in tobacco business, initial and annual fees, suspension and revocation,
13 registration and inspection of vending machines, bond by distributor, jurisdiction, and
14 licensing of promotional activities, by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

15 "(5) Any licensed dealer may apply for a special event tobacco permit for off-premise
16 sales of cigars, cigarettes, or loose or smokeless tobacco for a special event or a
17 temporary location offsite from the licensed location. Such permit may be authorized for
18 a period of one day but not more than ten days, and there shall be no limitation as to the
19 number of such permits a licensed dealer may be issued. The special event tobacco
20 permit shall include the specific address for the event or temporary location and the dates
21 for the period that the permit will be in effect. The fee for a special event tobacco permit
22 shall not exceed \$10.00. All such permits shall be issued by the commissioner, who shall
23 make rules and regulations with respect to applications for and issuance of special event
24 tobacco permits."

25 **SECTION 2.**

26 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
27 without such approval.

28 **SECTION 3.**

29 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
