## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Dr. Amy Stevens and recognizing February 20, 2018, as Female Veteran's Day
- 2 at the state capitol; and for other purposes.
  
- 3 WHEREAS, Dr. Amy Stevens is a mental health consultant and military veteran advocate
- 4 in Marietta, Georgia, who works with numerous federal, state, and local agencies which seek
- 5 to provide mental health services to service members, veterans, and their families; and
  
- 6 WHEREAS, Dr. Stevens is a military advisor to former First Lady Rosalyn Carter's Military
- 7 Family Caregiver Program and to the Georgia Department of Veteran Services, is the founder
- 8 of the social media group Georgia Military Women, and is very active in Disabled American
- 9 Veterans, Marietta Chapter 6; and
  
- 10 WHEREAS, a licensed professional counselor in the State of Georgia, volunteer Red Cross
- 11 Disaster Mental Health Manager, and published author, her most recent full-time position
- 12 was as Director of Psychological Health for the Georgia National Guard; and
  
- 13 WHEREAS, women of all ages, ranks, and levels of authority have served in the armed
- 14 forces of the United States since as early as the Revolutionary War; and
  
- 15 WHEREAS, they have since entered into every branch of service, have made significant
- 16 contributions, and have suffered the same sacrifices as men; and
  
- 17 WHEREAS, we owe a debt of gratitude to our veterans and wish to express our appreciation
- 18 for their selfless service to this state and the United States, and Dr. Stevens' vision and
- 19 unyielding commitment to the mental health and well-being of this country's veterans have
- 20 set the standard for public service.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
22 the members of this body commend Dr. Amy Stevens on her outstanding service to this state  
23 and nation and recognize February 20, 2018, as Female Veteran's Day at the state capitol.
