## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing October 21, 2018, as Sweet Auburn Bread Company Day at the state capitol;  
2 and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Chef Sonya Jones, who lives in Atlanta, Georgia, is the owner of Sweet Auburn  
4 Bread Company, where she continues the tradition of southern African American baking and  
5 will be celebrating 21 years of business this year; and

6 WHEREAS, Sonya Jones studied at the Culinary Institute of America, then returned to  
7 Atlanta after graduating, determined to become a success; and

8 WHEREAS, she worked with southern food icon, Edna Lewis, opened a bakery that sold  
9 made-from-scratch desserts, and, after receiving rave reviews, began a successful mail-order  
10 business; and

11 WHEREAS, Sonya Jones has also made media appearances on Food Network shows with  
12 Rachael Ray and Bobby Flay, runs a catering service, and sells a line of private label jellies  
13 and dessert sauces; and

14 WHEREAS, over the course of her career, her desserts have received praise from the likes  
15 of former President Bill Clinton and Food Network star Rachael Ray; and

16 WHEREAS, in 2008, she was honored by *Ebony* magazine's "Taste of Ebony" awards as one  
17 of the nation's top Black Pastry Chefs; and

18 WHEREAS, her business was selected as one of the Best Bakeries in the South by *Southern*  
19 *Living*, and she has received praise from both *Flavors* and *Taste of the South*, among several  
20 other magazines; and

21 WHEREAS, when CNN ran a segment regarding the economic crisis and its effect on small  
22 businesses, Sweet Auburn Bread Company was dubbed "The Little Bakery That Could"; and

23 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the hard work and achievements of Chef  
24 Sonya Jones and the success of Sweet Auburn Bread Company be appropriately recognized.

25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
26 the members of this body recognize October 21, 2018, as Sweet Auburn Bread Company  
27 Day at the state capitol.
