A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Lynn Bailey Cadle; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
3 with the passing of Lynn Bailey Cadle on January 11, 2018; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Lynn Bailey Cadle was born on September 9, 1941, a beloved daughter of
5 Warren and Ann Bailey; and
- 6 WHEREAS, a woman of deep and abiding faith, Lynn was an active member of St. Paul's
7 Episcopal Church; and
- 8 WHEREAS, she was united in love and marriage to her husband, Fred, and was blessed with
9 six remarkable children, Steve, Ayn, Christy, Kim, Mary, and Laura; 14 wonderful
10 grandchildren, Lyndsay, Bailey, Emily, Alex, Matthew, Jordan, Andrew, Adam, Megan,
11 Will, Laynie, Michael, Braden, and Anna Claire; and one outstanding great-granddaughter,
12 Ava; and
- 13 WHEREAS, she gave inspiration to many through her high ideals, morals, and deep concern
14 for her fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding she demonstrated to
15 her family and friends were admired by others; and
- 16 WHEREAS, she was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation
17 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example she made of her life,
18 she made this world a better place in which to live; and
- 19 WHEREAS, she earned both her master's and doctorate degrees in education from the
20 University of Georgia; and

21 WHEREAS, she later served as the Special Education Director for Burke County and
22 Columbia County where she was a timeless advocate for children; and

23 WHEREAS, she was elected the first female Superintendent of Columbia County Schools;

25 WHEREAS, she earned the prestigious distinction as a Woman of Excellence in Education
26 given by the YWCA and the Girl Scout Council of Augusta; and

27 WHEREAS, she continued to give back to her community after retirement from the public
28 school system by teaching at the collegiate level and was acting chair of the Department of
29 Clinical and Professional Studies at Augusta State University, active advisor for the Parent
30 Infant Network of Educational Services, and a member of the St. Paul's Episcopal Church
31 choir; and

32 WHEREAS, a compassionate, gracious, and generous woman, Dr. Cadle will long be
33 remembered for her love of family and friendship and will be missed by all who had the great
34 fortune of knowing her.

35 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
36 join in honoring the life and memory of Lynn Bailey Cadle and express their deepest and
37 most sincere regret at her passing.
