- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Christopher Lee Haynie; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
3 with the passing of Christopher Lee Haynie on February 9, 2018; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Christopher was born on July 26, 1971, in Atlanta, Georgia, a beloved son of
5 Joe and Zelma Haynie; and
- 6 WHEREAS, he served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty with the United
7 States Army, valiantly and courageously protecting his fellow Americans during Operation
8 Desert Storm as an equipment records parts specialist; and
- 9 WHEREAS, a man of deep and abiding faith, Christopher was an active member of Dixon
10 Grove Baptist Church; and
- 11 WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern
12 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his
13 family and friends were admired by others; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Christopher graduated from North Fulton High School, attended Tuskegee
15 University, graduated from Savannah State University with a bachelor's degree in computer
16 science technology and earned a master's degree in business administration from the Keller
17 Graduate School of Management; and
- 18 WHEREAS, he had recently completed his project management certification at Georgia State
19 University, and begun his professional career at NCR and the Teradata Corporation; and

20 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation
21 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example he made of his life, he
22 made this world a better place in which to live; and

23 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Christopher will long be remembered for
24 his love of family and friendship and will be missed by all who had the great fortune of
25 knowing him.

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
27 join in honoring the life and memory of Christopher Lee Haynie and express their deepest
28 and most sincere regret at his passing.
