- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Dr. Ann L. Hardman; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
3 with the passing of Dr. Ann L. Hardman on March 19, 2018; and
- 4 WHEREAS, a native of Asheville, North Carolina, she was passionately involved in
5 advancing the Kingdom of God with her unique ability to discern the voice of the Lord
6 through Scriptures; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Dr. Hardman also worked diligently in the advancement and development of
8 individuals who desire to better their lives and was heavily involved in life skills and
9 leadership development; and
- 10 WHEREAS, she spent much of her time traveling around the globe to assist others through
11 conferences, seminars, and leadership meetings; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Dr. Hardman was an entrepreneur; the wife of Dr. Norman Hardman, a mother
13 of four children, and a grandmother; and was a highly anointed and sought after speaker
14 raised up by God as an apostolic-prophetic voice to the world; and
- 15 WHEREAS, she was the apostolic voice over two rapidly growing churches, namely Faith
16 Worship Center International located in Columbus, Georgia, and River of Life International
17 located in Asheville, North Carolina; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Dr. Hardman was also the presiding prelate and Bishop of Endowed with Power
19 Ministerial Fellowship, where she covered several churches, businesses, and ministries; and

20 WHEREAS, known as a woman with great vision and an astonishing success rate, she
21 received her doctorate degrees from St. Thomas Christian College in Jacksonville, Florida,
22 and Beacon University in Columbus, Georgia; and

23 WHEREAS, she was the recipient of many awards and honors in her area of service and was
24 consistently pursuing more opportunities to assist others in accomplishing their dreams and
25 aspirations; and

26 WHEREAS, Dr. Hardman transformed, healed, and delivered many lives by the power of
27 God as she ministered hope to the hurting and called this generation back to the basic tenets
28 of the Christian faith; and

29 WHEREAS, her motto was "I am because He is; I can because He did; and I will because He
30 makes it possible"; and

31 WHEREAS, she is now spiritually healed and has made it home to be with the Lord; and

32 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous woman, Dr. Hardman will long be remembered
33 for her commitment to witnessing Christ through word and deed and will be missed by all
34 who had the great fortune of knowing her.
