

## House Resolution 4

## A RESOLUTION

1 Ratifying the amendment to the Constitution of the United States repealing the 18th  
2 Amendment regarding prohibition; and for other purposes.

4 WHEREAS, on February 20, 1933, the United States Congress proposed and offered to the  
5 states for ratification an amendment to the Constitution of the United States which provided:

6 "Section 1. The eighteenth article of amendment to the Constitution of the United States  
7 is hereby repealed.

8 Section 2. The transportation or importation into any State, Territory, or possession of  
9 the United States for delivery or use therein of intoxicating liquors, in violation of the  
10 laws thereof, is hereby prohibited.

11 Section 3. This article shall be inoperative unless it shall have been ratified as an  
12 amendment to the Constitution by conventions in the several States, as provided in the  
13 Constitution, within seven years from the date of the submission hereof to the States by  
14 the Congress."; and

15 WHEREAS, while a sufficient number of states have ratified this proposed amendment to  
16 make this amendment effective and a part of the Constitution of the United States, this state  
17 has never ratified this amendment.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
19 GEORGIA that the aforesaid amendment to the Constitution of the United States is hereby  
20 ratified.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor shall transmit a certified copy of this  
22 Resolution to the National Archives and Records Administration; to the President of the  
23 United States Senate; to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives; and to  
24 each member of the Congressional delegation from this state.
