A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Leadership Cobb and the members of the Leadership Cobb
2 Class of 2019; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Leadership Cobb was founded in 1983 by a nucleus of leaders in order to train
4 a new group of leaders to guide Cobb County's future; and

5 WHEREAS, Leadership Cobb owes a special debt of gratitude to its founders, Harris Hines,
6 Johnny Isakson, Phil Sanders, and Jay Whorton, and their vision for Cobb County, as well
7 as the Cobb County Chamber of Commerce for its continued support of the program; and

8 WHEREAS, Leadership Cobb, from hundreds of qualified applications, selected only 50
9 diverse and exceptionally qualified individuals for the Class of 2019 to provide a learning
10 environment that enhances personal and professional growth to benefit the individual, his or

16 of which require serious dedication but help the participants become more engaged citizens;
