A RESOLUTION

1 Commending and recognizing the Atlanta Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity,
2 Inc., on the grand occasion of its ninety-fifth anniversary; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, having served continuously in the Metropolitan Atlanta Area, the Southeastern
4 Province (Region), and the State of Georgia since February 22, 1924, the Atlanta Alumni
5 Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., celebrates its ninety-fifth anniversary; and

6 WHEREAS, the charter members were Dr. Hamilton M. Holmes, a prominent physician,
7 Polemarch, Dr. A. B. Cooper, a well-respected dentist, Vice Polemarch, James E. Stamps,
8 J. R. Pinkett, Byron H. Gentry, and G. E. Wilson along with Undergraduate Brothers Graham
9 and Owens from Delta and Xi chapters; and

10 WHEREAS, the Atlanta Alumni Chapter has had in its chapter two Laurel Wreath Wearers
11 (highest fraternity honor) in Civil Rights Trailblazer, Donald L. Hollowell and Coca-Cola
12 Executive Vice President, Carl Ware, along with Five Elder Watson Diggs Honorees (second
13 highest fraternity honor) in J.A. Lockett, Sterling Dover, W. Kenneth Jackson, Sr., Judge
14 Mark A. Scott, and Melvin T. Solomon; and

15 WHEREAS, the Atlanta Alumni Chapter has had two Guy L. Grant Awardees (highest
16 undergraduate honor) in Reginald R. Jackson, M.D., and Steven Pritchett, J.D., as well as a
17 Byron K. Armstrong Awardee (scholastic achievement), Kevin Sigler; and

18 WHEREAS, the Atlanta Alumni Chapter has Five Past Province Polemarch as members of
19 its chapter in Melvin T. Solomon, W. Kenneth Jackson, Sr., Judge Mark A. Scott, Dr. Stanley
20 Pritchett, Sr., and James Freeman; and

21 WHEREAS, the Atlanta Alumni Chapter has numerous other Province and local awardees
22 with distinction as indicated by the former Mayor of Atlanta, Kasim Reed; Superior Court
23 Judge Marvin Arrington; first African American pediatric surgeon in the United States, Dr.

24 James Densler; first African American state trooper in Georgia, Robert Hightower; and the
25 first African American polygraph examiner in DeKalb County, Georgia, James Freeman; and

26 WHEREAS, the Atlanta Alumni Chapter promotes a style of intellectual and aesthetic
