A RESOLUTION

1 Urging state agencies and departments to publish or deliver their reports to the General
2 Assembly by electronic means whenever possible; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, it is a duty of this body to manage the resources of the state; and

4 WHEREAS, as stewards of taxpayer funds, it is our responsibility to conserve resources and
5 eliminate waste wherever possible; and

6 WHEREAS, we urge state agencies and departments to review their processes for delivering
7 reports, whether required by statute or voluntarily produced; and

8 WHEREAS, in order to conserve taxpayer resources, we urge all state agencies and
9 departments to take advantage of the "digital age" and publish annual reports on their
10 websites when feasible; and

11 WHEREAS, those agencies and departments required by law to submit reports to the General
12 Assembly shall deliver reports by electronic means wherever possible in order to facilitate
13 a decrease in physical hard copy reports, thereby cutting department expenditures and further
14 protecting the resources of the citizens of this state; and

15 WHEREAS, when the agency or department is not required to distribute copies of an annual
16 report to members of the General Assembly but is required to notify members of the
17 availability of the annual report, it should do so in the manner which it deems to be most
18 effective and efficient.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
20 urge state agencies and departments to publish or deliver reports to the General Assembly
21 by electronic means whenever possible, notwithstanding any law to the contrary requiring
22 reports to be delivered by physical hard copy.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
24 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the state agencies
25 and departments of the State of Georgia.
