A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing Jerusalem as the capital of Israel; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Georgia has a deep history and connection with the State of Israel; and
- 3 WHEREAS, former Governor Zell Miller established the Georgia-Israel Exchange in 1992
- 4 to explore emerging technology, enhance trade, encourage tourism, and jointly participate
- 5 in economic development programs; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Atlanta is home to the Consulate General of the State of Israel; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia has had continuous representation in Israel since 1994, and
- 8 Ronen Kenan has led the state's trade activities in Israel since 2010; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the American-Israel Chamber of Commerce Southeast Division, which was
- 10 established in 1992, to help Israeli and Southeastern business relationships and whose
- 11 chamber is headquartered in Atlanta; and
- 12 WHEREAS, since the establishment of the Chamber, it has been involved in completed
- 13 transactions valued at more than \$1 billion; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce signed a Memorandum of
- 15 Understanding with the Federation of Israeli Chambers of Commerce in 2012 as an
- 16 agreement to work to strengthen economic relations between their countries; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the State of Israel has made its capital Jerusalem, the capital the Jewish people
- 18 established in ancient times; and
- 19 WHEREAS, in December, 2017, President Donald J. Trump moved the United States
- 20 embassy to Jerusalem.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
22 hereby recognize that Jerusalem is the capital of the State of Israel.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
24 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
25 press.
