

The Senate Committee on Public Safety offered the following substitute to HB 339:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 40-2-86 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
2 special license plates promoting and supporting certain beneficial projects, agencies, funds,  
3 or nonprofit corporations, so as to establish a specialty license plate to benefit Alabama  
4 A&M University; to establish a specialty license plate to benefit the Autism Alliance of  
5 Georgia; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to provide for  
6 compliance with constitutional requirements; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other  
7 purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

10 Code Section 40-2-86 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to special license  
11 plates promoting and supporting certain beneficial projects, agencies, funds, or nonprofit  
12 corporations, is amended by adding new paragraphs to subsection (l) to read as follows:

13 "(58) A special license plate honoring Alabama A&M University. The funds raised by  
14 the sale of this special license plate shall be disbursed to the Alabama A&M University  
15 Alumni Association, Inc., and used to provide scholarships and financial assistance to  
16 Georgia residents attending the university. Such special license plate shall include the  
17 phrase 'Go Bulldogs' in lieu of the county of issuance.

18 (59) A special license plate promoting autism awareness. The funds raised by the sale  
19 of this special license plate shall be disbursed to the Autism Alliance of Georgia. Such  
20 special license plate shall include the phrase 'Autism Awareness' in lieu of the name of  
21 the county of issuance."

22 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 2.**

23 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law  
24 without such approval.

**SECTION 3.**

26 In accordance with the requirements of Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI(n) of the  
27 Constitution of the State of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the  
28 requisite two-thirds' majority vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

**SECTION 4.**

30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
