## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Music Workforce Development; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the music industry has made significant contribution to Georgia's economy; and
- 4 WHEREAS, fostering and expansion of the Georgia-based music industry will lead to further
- 5 significant contribution to the economy, job creation, and welfare of this state; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the music industry in Georgia, through the creativity and effort of many talented
- 7 and dedicated performers, producers, promoters, technicians, and others working in many
- 8 different musical genres and styles, has entertained and given great pleasure to millions of
- 9 people worldwide; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the music industry contributes substantially to the quality of life and economic
- 11 welfare of citizens of this state; and
- 12 WHEREAS, in light of the above, it is highly desirable to encourage and promote the
- 13 continued growth and success of the music industry in this state; and
- 14 WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to examine the following aspects of the music industry
- 15 in Georgia:
- 16 (1) The economic impact of the music industry in Georgia and ways to measure, expand,
- and promote the music economy statewide and foster integration with other creative
- 18 industries, including film, digital media, and gaming;
- 19 (2) The current mix of music content creators in Georgia and ways to retain and attract
- 20 talent while expanding music content as a net cultural export;
- 21 (3) The current state of the music and sound recording sector in Georgia and ways to
- support, promote, and grow that sector;

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23 (4) The current state of music technology and entrepreneurship and ways to support and

- 24 promote innovation and enterprise investment;
- 25 (5) Musical tour and theatrical production in Georgia and ways to develop, promote, and
- 26 attract investment from that sector of the industry;
- 27 (6) A review of the Georgia Music Investment Act and ways to improve and expand the
- 28 current law to be more competitive globally;
- 29 (7) A review of state incentives, infrastructure, and economic impact from the music
- 30 industry in other states;
- 31 (8) The business side of music in Georgia, taking into account various industry clusters,
- and ways to strengthen and expand the business of music; and
- 33 (9) The Georgia Music Hall of Fame and its awards ceremony and ways that the institution
- 34 can promote music in Georgia while providing for continued economic development.

## 35 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

- 36 (1) **Creation of Senate study committee.** There is created the Senate Study Committee
- on Music Workforce Development.
- 38 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of six members of the
- 39 Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate. The President of the Senate shall
- designate a member of the committee as chairperson of the committee.
- 41 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 44 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 46 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- 47 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

## 48 (5) Allowances and funding.

- 49 (A) Members of the committee who are members of the General Assembly shall
- receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of
- Georgia Annotated.
- 52 (B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
- of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
- necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the Senate.
- 56 (6) **Report.**
- 57 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the

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same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

- 61 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- of this paragraph.
- 64 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- the Secretary of the Senate.
- (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary
- of the Senate a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 70 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2019.
