3 WHEREAS, Mayor Bianca Motley Broom made history in becoming the first-ever African
4 American female mayor in the city's history of College Park; and

5 WHEREAS, the City of College Park contains a portion of Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta
6 International Airport, the world's busiest airport since 1998, including the domestic terminal,
7 Concourse T, Concourse A, and two-thirds of Concourse B; and

8 WHEREAS, the City of College Park welcomes millions of travelers to the great State of
9 Georgia every single year, displaying the state's great hospitality and southern charm; and

10 WHEREAS, the City of College Park is the fourth largest hospitality district in Georgia; and

11 WHEREAS, the City of College Park serves as home to the fourth largest urban historical
12 district registered with the National Register of Historic Places in the State of Georgia; and

13 WHEREAS, the City of College Park is the home of the Georgia International Convention
14 Center, the second largest convention center in the state; and

15 WHEREAS, the City of College Park is the home of Woodward Academy, the largest private
16 school in the United States; and

17 WHEREAS, the City of College Park serves as home to the headquarters of thriving
18 businesses such as ExpressJet Airlines and Chick-fil-A.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
20 the members of this body commend the City of College Park and recognize February 6,

21 2020, as College Park Day at the state capitol and extend best wishes for continued growth
22 and prosperity.
