A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and
2 traffic, so as to provide for the issuance of a traffic citation to a vehicle owner in lieu of the
3 individual operating the motor vehicle in certain instances; to provide for related matters; to
4 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

7 Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is
8 amended in Code Section 40-2-8, relating to operation of unregistered vehicle or vehicle
9 without current license plate, revalidation decal, or county decal, storage of unlicensed
10 vehicle, and temporary plate issued by dealers of new or used motor vehicles, by adding a
11 new subsection to read as follows:

12 "(d) In lieu of issuing a citation for a violation of this Code section to the individual
13 operating a motor vehicle, a law enforcement officer is authorized to issue a citation for a
14 violation of this Code section to the owner of the vehicle if such individual is present at the
15 time of issuance."

16 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 2.**

17 Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-8-7, relating to driving unsafe or improperly
18 equipped vehicle, punishment for violations of chapter generally, and vehicle inspection by
19 law enforcement officer without warrant, by adding a new subsection to read as follows:

20 "(e) In lieu of issuing a citation for a violation of this Code section to the individual
21 operating a motor vehicle, a law enforcement officer is authorized to issue a citation for a
22 violation of this Code section to the owner of the vehicle if such individual is present at the
23 time of issuance."

SECTION 3.

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
