A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 33-63-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 definitions regarding guaranteed asset protection waivers, so as to revise the definition of a
3 guaranteed asset protection waiver; to provide for an effective date and applicability; to
4 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

7 Code Section 33-63-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to definitions
8 regarding guaranteed asset protection waivers, is amended by revising paragraph (6), as
9 follows:

10 "(6) 'Guaranteed asset protection waiver' means a contractual agreement wherein a
11 creditor agrees, with or without a ~~for~~ a separate charge to cancel or waive all or part of
12 amounts due on a borrower's finance agreement in the event of a total physical damage
13 loss or unrecovered theft of the motor vehicle, which agreement must be part of, or a
14 separate addendum to, the finance agreement or a contractual agreement wherein a
15 creditor agrees, with or without a ~~for~~ a separate charge to cancel or waive all or part of
16 the excess wear and use charges owed by the borrower to the creditor under the lease

17 contract when the borrower returns a leased vehicle to the creditor at termination of the
18 lease, which agreement must be part of, or a separate addendum to, the lease contract.
19 Such waiver may also provide, with or without a separate charge, a benefit that waives
20 an amount, or provides a borrower with a credit, toward the purchase of a replacement
21 vehicle."

22 **SECTION 2.**

23 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2021, and apply to all guaranteed asset protection
24 waivers which become effective on or after January 1, 2022.

25 **SECTION 3.**

26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
