10 Baptist Church; and

12 four remarkable children, Ronnie, Donna, Becca, and Mary, as well as three wonderful  
13 grandchildren, Ellia, Eva, and Isabella; and

14 WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern  
15 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his  
16 family and friends were admired by others; and

17 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation  
18 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example he made of his life, he  
19 made this world a better place in which to live; and

20 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Louie I. Chance Jr. will long be  
21 remembered for his love of family, friendship, and community and will be missed by all who  
22 had the great fortune of knowing him.
