A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 3 of Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
2 relating to other state symbols, so as to designate cornbread as the official state bread; to  
3 provide legislative findings and declarations; to provide for related matters; to repeal  
4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

7 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:

8 (1) The colorful history and traditions of the State of Georgia are inextricably associated  
9 with the food traditions of corn and among the many legacies of this proud heritage is the  
10 delicious bread known as cornbread;

11 (2) Relied upon by indigenous people to sustain themselves, cornbread has transcended  
12 its humble origins to take a place of honor at such events as the Prater's Mill Country Fair  
13 in Whitfield County;

14 (3) With thousands of participants and visitors, such celebrations include cornbread  
15 cooked on a wood-burning stove and served with collard greens and pinto beans;

16 (4) Corn is grown, ground, and made into cornmeal at historic mills like Prater's Mill,  
17 Berry College Mill, and Ogeechee River Mill and modern mills like Southeastern Mills  
18 and Logan Turnpike Mill;

19 (5) Cornmeal is then sold in stores and served in eating establishments throughout the  
20 state, and cornbread is enjoyed by young and old at home and in restaurants; and

21 (6) Cornbread enjoys a singular stature in Georgia history and culture that is rivaled only  
22 by its undeniable appeal as a versatile and satisfying food. Establishing cornbread as the  
23 official Georgia state bread is necessary to fully recognize the importance of this product  
24 to this state.

25 **SECTION 2.**

26 Article 3 of Chapter 3 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to other  
27 state symbols, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

28 "50-3-92.

29 Cornbread is designated as the official Georgia state bread."

30 **SECTION 3.**

31 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
