The House Committee on Defense and Veterans Affairs offers the following substitute to SB 203:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Article 3 of Chapter 4 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 2 relating to industry services training program, so as to provide for tuition-free programs that 3 relate to the operation of a commercial motor vehicle for veterans; to amend Title 40 of the 4 Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, so as to provide 5 for hiring standards for commercial driver's license holders; to provide a short title; to 6 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

9 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Trucking Opportunity Act of 2024."

SECTION 2.
Article 3 of Chapter 4 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
industry services training program, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as
follows:

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14 ″<u>20-4-43.1.</u>

- Subject to appropriations by the General Assembly for such purposes, the training programs under this article entered into by a qualified participant that relate to the operation of a commercial motor vehicle shall be tuition free. For purposes of this Code
- 18 section, a qualified participant shall be a veteran of the United States armed forces who was
- 19 honorably discharged as evidenced by United States Department of Defense Form 214 or
- 20 <u>National Guard Bureau Form 22.</u>"

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SECTION 3.

Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is amended in Code Section 40-5-145, relating to duties of employer, by adding a new

- 24 subsection to read as follows:
- 25 "(c) Any person issued a commercial driver's license pursuant to this article and in
- 26 accordance with minimum federal standards shall be considered to possess the necessary
- 27 <u>qualifications to be hired and entrusted to operate a commercial motor vehicle, when:</u>
- 28 (1) Such driving privilege has not been suspended, revoked, or canceled or such driving
- 29 privilege is not subject to disqualification; and
- 30 (2) The employer conducted a preemployment investigation of such driver's record in
- 31 accordance with the time frame required by federal minimum standards or three years,
- 32 <u>whichever is greater.</u>"

SECTION 4.

34 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
